Lesson 8 The Desert

All the words in this lesson may be associated with the desert.

- absorb V. to soak up or take in (A cactus will absorb water from the ground or the air and store it in its thick stem.)
- **destruction** N. great damage or ruin (Heavy rains filled the river beds and caused the *destruction* of many bridges.)
- drought N. a long period of no rain; very dry weather (By August, the long drought had made the meadow look brown and dry.)
- cacti N. plural form of cactus, a desert plant with sharp spines or thorns. (Many cacti bloomed in the desert after the spring rains.)
- **cluster** N. items of the same kind that are grouped or that grow together (There were five blossoms in each *cluster* of cactus flowers.)
- erode V. to wear away gradually (When there is no moisture in the ground, the wind can erode the soil by blowing away the dusty top layer of dirt.)
- evaporate V. to change from a liquid or a solid into a gas (A puddle of rain water in the desert will evaporate quickly and leave the ground dry and hard.)
- extract V. to take out or pull out (The doctor had to use tweezers to extract the cactus thorn from the boy's finger.)
- frugal ADJ. using things wisely; not wasteful (He was frugal with his water on the hike and only drank small amounts when he was thirsty.)
- precipitation N. moisture in the form of rain or snow (Because there is very little precipitation in the desert, only plants that will grow in dry soil can survive.)
- prey N. an animal hunted by another animal for food (Catching the rabbit in its jaws, the desert fox began to eat its *prey*.)
- prickly ADJ. having many sharp points or thorns (People who touch a prickly cactus are often scratched by thorns.)
- **protect** V. guard from harm or danger (We must *protect* the beauty of our deserts for future generations to enjoy.)
- **pulpy** ADJ. spongy and moist (He chewed the *pulpy* inside of the cactus stem to squeeze out the liquid that it held.)
- spines N. sharp, pointed growth on a plant or animal (Most animals will not eat a cactus because of the sharp *spines* that cover the plant.)
- **swoop** V. to sweep down upon in a sudden attack (The great horned owl will *swoop* down from the sky to catch small mice on the ground.)
- topsoil N. the top or upper part of the soil (Many small plants grow in the sandy topsoil of the desert.)
- unusual ADJ. uncommon; not ordinary (Desert plants and wildlife may seem unusual to people who live in the Midwest.)
- variety N. a number of different kinds (The desert supports many types of plants along with a large *variety* of wildlife.)
- vegetation N. plant life (The desert has very little vegetation because few plants will grow where it is so dry.)
