Warts and All

Did you ever have warts? You know, those ugly little growths on your hands that you would do anything to get rid of. When I was nineteen, I had a great big one right on the first knuckle of my index finger where everyone could see it . . . and give advice

about what I should do about it. I'm here to tell you that there are a bunch of home remedies for warts, ranging from putting bananas (or cabbages or radishes or . . .) on the wart to drawing a circle with a pen around the infection to covering it with nail polish.

There are also several medical solutions to the problem including injection of medication into the wart and surgical removal of the wart. The most common of these medical treatments is cryotherapy in which the wart is frozen and later falls off. In a recent study, cryotherapy was proven to be successful sixty percent of the time.

You already know our friend Sheikh Jamal Rahman, one of the Interfaith Amigos of Seattle, who has presented the commentary here at St. Francis several times. And you may have already read the Interfaith Amigos' book *Getting to the Heart of Interfaith* (it's in our Library for Peace) which tells us how and why they formed their interfaith collaboration between a pastor, a rabbi and an imam.

Now we have their second book, *Religion Gone Astray*, which ventures into the four problem areas that divide the three Abrahamic religions: **Exclusivity** (One and only faith), **Violence** (Justifying brutality in the name of faith), **Inequality of Men and Women** (The patriarchal stranglehold on power), and **Homophobia** (A denial of legitimacy). With honesty, vulnerability and compassion each one explores the areas of these beliefs that are used to separate us, and how these areas can also be used to open the way to collaboration and healing. And, as in their first book, they entertain as well as educate us.

This book is a must-read for all of us who are concerned about the anti-Muslim rhetoric and anti-semitic behavior that is far too prevalent these days.

Flushable wipes are NOT flushable?

In Tucson in 2015, the University of Arizona Medical Center had to shut down 17 operating rooms, send 2 patients to another campus and reschedule 41 other surgeries while hospital toilets were being unclogged because of socalled "flushable" wipes.

The package says "flushable" but contractors
