University Competition



Fiercest competition for university places in recent years! Why?

- Widening Access Programme aims to tackle inequality (33.4% D.U. places).
- Foreign students no fees are paid in Scotland.
- Five Scottish universities ranked in 'top 200' IN THE WORLD.
- Dundee University Scottish University of the year 2016 & 2017 (stolen by Glasgow this year).

"Scottish students find it "more difficult" to get into some university courses than a decade ago, an MSP has claimed . . . the Scottish Government's cap on university places for Scottish and EU students, who receive free tuition, is leading to increased demand and pushing up entry requirements for some subjects."

THE number of Scottish applicants missing out on a university place has almost doubled in a decade as the SNP faced further accusations of creating a clearing system that favours English school leavers.

Ucas yesterday published data showing that the number of Scots who failed to win a place after the 2006 admissions cycle was 8,625 but this had risen to a record 16,520 last year.

The SNP's free tuition policy is only affordable because ministers impose a cap on the number of places allocated

University of Dundee

Most competitive courses:

- Medicine and Dentistry 11 applicants per place. Elite applicant pool. UKCAT.
- Primary Education 13 applicants per place.
- Art and Design 8 applicants per place.
- Humanities (English, History, Philosophy etc.)
 - -14 applicants per place.
- Also business, nursing and sports related courses increasing numbers of rejections!



Impact on Entry Requirements

Higher expectations – minimum of THREE Highers in one sitting, ideally FOUR.

- A combination of A and Bs an A in a subject area does not guarantee a place.
- Certified grades are more desirable than predicted grades.
- Stringent Testing/ Interview process i.e. introduction of new assessment for Humanities at Dundee.
- Personal Statement must be of a VERY high standard.

Skills and Experiences

`Our degree programmes do not require entrants with academic ability alone, but with a range of skills which show the suitability of a candidate for the subject of their choice.' (Dundee University)

- Work Experience (flexibility in new timetable)
- Volunteering.
- Attendance at related events.
- Involvement in school community/ wider community.
- Leadership/ Saltire/ Duke of Edinburgh/ Volunteering awards – all taken into consideration.
- Foundation Apprenticeships & HN Infill options.



Alternative Routes

 A number of HNC and HND courses can provide 'articulation' into degree courses at partner universities (including Dundee, Aberdeen, and St Andrews) with entry into year 2 or 3.

E.g. Humanities (Year One at D & A College) Year 2 onwards at Dundee Uni to complete a Master of Arts.



Graduate Level Apprenticeships Introduced in 2017

 An increasing number of companies and universities working together to provide these including Dundee University.

Key subject areas include engineering, finance, IT and business.

Benefits:

- Companies are funded so students save money and are paid while achieving a degree.
- They develop key skills in a workplace environment making them more employable than traditional graduates (they build up contacts/ clients etc.)
