

The Airline Professional Loadmaster Series



The Airline Professional Loadmaster: The Flying Emus

Dave Bell and Karl Hinkamp would like to introduce Jay Cadmus as our **guest columnist** for this issue's Airline PLM. Jay has been a Loadmaster for several airlines as well as in the military. He has flown as a Loadmaster on DC-8s, B-747s, B-767s and the C-141B. We sincerely thank Jay for relating his personal experience as an airline Loadmaster on a unique and challenging charter flight..... For years, live animals have been moved on commercial platforms – trucks, trains, ships and planes. Military movement of live animals was born out of necessity (natural disasters and relocating villages in Vietnam). International horseracing used airplanes to move horses from continent to continent and coast-to-coast in the U.S. since the 1950s. The airline I was working for routinely flew cattle charters out of Miami International Airport on DC-8s. Airlines, like all businesses, are always searching for new revenue streams. Our Miami freight broker proposed a new charter - moving a load of Emus (a relative of the Ostrich) from Miami to Manaus, Brazil. Management found nothing in the FARs or IATA regulations prohibiting this movement. The aircraft was configured similar to a cattle charter, where the cargo compartment floor is lined with empty pallets with a series of plywood walls interconnected with hinges and bolts, all secured to the pallets with straps. The floors of the pallets were lined with plastic, then covered with wood chips or some other form of absorbent material. In addition to the pilots, flight engineer and Loadmaster, we also had a flight mechanic (common for most charters) and an animal handler (familiar with the transportation and health of this species). The airplane was positioned from Fort Lauderdale to Miami and the Emus were trucked to the Agricultural Building at Miami International. Loading and departure all went normal. Once at cruise altitude,

we settled in for a long flight. The Emu's settled in for a long flight also and made themselves at home. However, we soon realized that the odor produced by cattle was tame compared to these 6 ft. tall birds. As we proceeded to Brazil, the toxic fumes in the cargo compartment continued to get worse and worse. The insidious creep of colorless, gaseous ammonia creates a pungent smell. It is caustic and hazardous in concentration. Exposure to gaseous ammonia for more than 30 minutes can produce irreversible health effects. "Navy Standards" established by The Bureaus of Ships in 1962 dictated maximum allowable concentrations to one hour. Ammonia vapor has a sharp, irritating, pungent odor that acts as a warning of potentially dangerous exposure. The odor impacted everyone on board. I suggested using oxygen to clear noses and throats. Onboard oxygen was limited, so only the front-end crew donned masks. At first we considered returning to Miami or making an emergency stop at an enroute airport. The Emu urine fumes were so overwhelming that the aircraft's air conditioning system wasn't able to recycle the air fast enough to clear out the toxic fumes. Ultimately, we exercised the 'wet cloth' technique and continued to Brazil, in classic "freight dog" tradition.

Task Force 1

Doug Gardiner, Task Force 1 - Due to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus outbreak, the FAA has issued a statement for air carriers participating in flights from China; navigate to https://www.faa.gov/news/updates/?newsId=94991 to see the latest guidance. This highlights our exposure to different bacteria and viruses when traveling all over the world. While we assume the risk is marginal,

there are times when risk increases. Commercial aviation has brought the world closer together, which brings advantages and disadvantages. Kalitta Charters has been involved in moving some passengers from Asia to the US. Crain news reported on the flight https://www.crainsdetroit.com/news/willow-runs-kalitta-airferries-us-citizens-back-china-amid-coronavirus. Another article on the event was retrieved from Nikkie Asian Review at https:// asia.nikkei.com/Spotlight/Coronavirus-outbreak/Operation-Wuhan-How-US-and-Japan-planned-evacuations-of-citizens. In other FAA news, the latest revision to weight and balance Advisory Circular 120-27F is May 2019 (https://www.faa.gov/ documentLibrary/media/Advisory Circular/AC 120-27F.pdf). This establishes guidance for weight and balance programs for the commercial sector. Military Loadmasters will know many terms used and is an excellent introduction into commercial publications. Advisory Circulars are not mandatory in nature but have the weight of a good suggestion and useful information. Another Advisory Circular commercial Loadmasters might want to know is AC 120-85A (https://www.faa.gov/documentLibrary/ media/Advisory_Circular/AC_120-85A.pdf) with information about how to transport cargo. The FAA Loadmaster Certification Working Group report is still under review by the FAA and no new information is available. We have commented on the report in previous "The Loaders," but if you would like to read it again, the report from the group is posted at https://www.faa.gov/regulations policies/rulemaking/committees/documents/media/LCWG%20 Recommendation% 20Report% 20May% 2018% 202018% 20 -%20FINAL1.pdf. We will continue to monitor FAA activity.

Dear Ms. Disney,

This past July I was invited as the guest speaker for the Professional Loadmasters Association (PLA) Conference in Tacoma, WA. It is rare when I am asked to speak that I attend the full convention. However, the 2019 "Gathering of Loads" was different—I chose to attend every session to gain a first-hand perspective of the organization, its goals, and the professional development program that was offered. What those in attendance and I saw was overwhelming!

Every aspect of the conference was First Class! I witnessed professional development seminars that were focused on our young crew force—they easily equaled programs I have seen at much larger conferences. Equally impressive was the respect paid to our history and those whose past deeds provide inspiration to the current generation of Air Force Loadmasters. Highlights included an inspiring briefing from two crew members on the ill-fated C-5 that crash during Operation Babylift ... Col Regina Aunie, the founder of modern aeromedical evacuation and CMSgt Ray Snedegar, the senior loadmaster on the flight. Their session brought many to tears. The highlight of their briefing was their reunion with three survivors of the crash—it was a powerful moment! That was followed with briefing from an Iranian hostage who endured 444 days in captivity. His brief was followed by a member of the Special Operations team that tried to rescue the Iranian hostages. In another inspirational moment, they met for the first time on stage ... an Iranian hostage and the rescuer who risked his life to free him! Moments like these are witnessed by few and the PLA attendees always count themselves as lucky to have heard these stories from those who were there!

I'd like to express my personal thank you and congratulations to the PLA for hosting a tremendous and inspiring event. Additionally, I highly recommend continued support for the conference by the Air Force and the Mobility community. The benefit of a young loadmaster attending will pay dividends for decades to come!






