## **Reflection on Photographs on Social Media (by Bishop Toal)**

An incident occurred at Christmas where a parish included a photograph of a young girl on its Facebook page which was subsequently shared on the Diocesan Facebook page. The mother of the young child complained about this and asked that it be removed from both locations, which it was soon afterwards. To clarify the position for the diocese and parishes, I asked Donna Maguire, the Archivist and Record Manager for the Scottish Catholic Archive, to provide some clarity and guidance and I would like to share that with you. *The first question is to determine if a photo is personal data. The guidelines are – Where a person is the focus of an image, the image is likely to be personal data, and consent is needed. Where people are incidentally included in an image or are not the focus, the image is unlikely to contain or be considered personal data – such as the congregation or a large group; It should be enough for us to verbally ask permission to make recordings with reminders on posters to ensure GDPR compliance. Anyone not wishing to be included needs to be given the opportunity to opt out. But if images or video are going to be used on social media or websites then consent must be obtained as it will be seen outside the EU. Where images are those of people who have died, then GDPR does not apply. We could claim “Legitimate interest” as a base to go ahead without consent. However, the legitimate interest of the individual will be upheld over the business/charity in most cases. It is legitimate interest for charities to maintain a presence on social media as it is a key tool in building a profile and increasingly vital for marketing purposes. It can provide an easy way both to keep in touch with supporters and share news with an audience well beyond a traditional mailing list. However when using social media we need to be aware and ensure best practice in order to protect ourselves. I will be developing a good practice guide for social media in the near future to add to the other policies on the BCOS web site.*

*As regards a Take Down policy, as soon as an objection is made you should take down the digital image from all platforms as the parish and this you have done. This is seen as reasonable and acceptable and should be stated in your terms and condition of your web site. Facebook are the data controllers of that platform; their terms and condition can be convoluted to say the least and tend to be focused on harassment and hate speech.*

*Going back to your example of issue, the mother is right to ask for the photo to be taken down. If the child is not the focus of the image then you did not need consent. If the image was taken during Mass I would say that this is legitimate interest and would not need consent. If she is the focus of the image then consent should have been sought.*

*It is not completely clear on how we collect consent for individuals and this is something we will be looking at soon. It could be via a form or a notice, but we can no longer assume consent that much is clear.*

I accept that this is helpful only to a degree but hopefully we will have clearer guidance in due course.
