HEADINGS FOR READINGS:

First: Exodus 24 : Moses reads the book of the covenant to the people, and they promise to be obedient: he dashes the people with the the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made.

Psalms 115 : The cup of salvation I will raise, I will call on the Lord's name / How can I repay the Lord / O precious in the eyes of the Lord / A thanksgiving sacrifice I make.

Second: Hebrews 9 : Christ is the mediator of a new covenant, through his sacrifice, so that those who are called may receive the promised eternal inheritance, because a death has occurred that redeems them from the transgressions under the first covenant.

Gospel: Mark 14 : Jesus disciples prepare for the Passover Meal, and Jesus eats it with them and celebrates the first Eucharist: he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take; this is my body." Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many"

Rt Rev. Joseph Toal Bishop of Motherwell:

Dear Fathers and Deacons,

I hope this finds everybody well.

I take this opportunity to thank everyone who attended the Days on Health and Safety. I hope the information offered will be of benefit.

It has been worrying to hear of the recent break-ins to some of our presbyteries, and even more so of the physical assault on Fr Hennessy when he opened his door to a caller.

I think extra precautions are necessary to protect ourselves, especially when we stay on our own – should a time be set after which we don't answer the door?

Of course this should be explained to parishioners and information given whereby they can contact a priest after the set time for the door not being answered.

There is opportunity here also to tell people that the Chapel House is the private residence of the priests of the parish, and others only have access with his approval and at his discretion.

If some priests open part of the house for parish activities it cannot be presumed that others will. If any activities do take place in the house they must be fully compliant with the safeguarding, health and safety, and data protection regulations we have in place. The number of people with keys to chapel houses, and indeed to parish halls and other properties, should be strictly limited to those who now need to have them. Changing locks in sometimes advisable and I ask you to do that if you are at all worried about the security of the parish properties. Sometimes access is allowed, and perhaps has gone on for far too long, without sufficient reason and parish priests can decide when this should stop. It is best done though with good explanation of why change is necessary. Parish Halls can be difficult to manage so it is important that both parish groups and externals users are made aware of the regulations to be abided by and the respect due to other users of the premises. It is dangerous when halls become the kingdom almost of particular groups or individuals and it can be difficult for new parish priests in particular to change how things have operated. But change is sometimes necessary but tact and diplomacy are needed while offering a good explanation of what is now expected.

As clergy we do need help in managing halls and the issues that can arise from misuse, so it is usually beneficial to form a team of reliable people so that things are run well and the necessary rules respected.

I have written this to offer support and they can be used when necessary.

As already said though good communication helps if changes are to be made which may upset some.
