

The West Branch Heritage Museum has been in existence for rough fifty two year. It houses a collection of items that are tied to the West Branch area history. Exhibits can be seen throughout the year.

Five years ago we received a \$40,000 matching grant for building restoration Some of the things this grant enable us to do was add a new roof, reinforce the ceiling, new heating and air conditioning, insulation, replacement of decaying wood, upgrade lighting, and glass replacement. There weren't sufficient funds available at the time to install plumbing and add a restroom.

In the spring 2017, we began working with the West Branch Community Development Group to see what help the Main Street program might have to offer. There is sufficient space at the back of the building to construct an addition which would house storage, a handicap entrance, and an ADA compliant restroom. There is a price tag of \$55,000 associated with this addition. To date though generous donations \$45,000 of the \$55,000 has been raises for the project.

Since the building restoration five years ago, museum members have been cataloging the accumulated collections. Members—who are all volunteers, meet twice a month for cataloging activities and future planning.

The museum is always looking for new members and volunteers. Being a member or volunteer is fun, informative, and there is no age requirements or experience required.


