DIRECTOR



BENJAMIN CURÉ

Benjamin Curé was born and raised in Melbourne where he trained at both scholarships The Edge Performers School and The Space Dance and Arts Centre. In 2015, he founded Lion Heart Dance Company and has produced multiple seasons of work over the ensuing years.

Curé has also performed within a number of different contexts in both the contemporary and commercial worlds of dance while also venturing into cross-disciplinary art forms. His performance career has seen him work with companies like Vertical Shadows Dance Company, Opera Australia, Rain and Lucky as well as So You Think You Can Dance Australia.

In 2013 Curé created and performed in his first full-length work, *The Scarlet Trace*. Following its success, the show was then remounted by Candlelight Productions for a return season in 2014. In 2016, Curé tenaciously created and produced the two works for Lion Heart Dance Company in its first year of operation - *Table of Eight* and *Fabricated*.

In 2017, he was commissioned by City of Booroondara to co-present a remount of *The Scarlet Trace*. In 2018 he was the artistic director of *Inhabit Dance Festival* which saw innovative dance performances placed along venues on Chapel St. Later in 2018 he directed Lion Heart's season of *ENVISION* which was presented at The Space Dance and Arts Centre. In March, 2019, he choreographed and directed *Still Frame* at Chapel off Chapel and is thrilled to be returning to the stage in this new work, *Alight*.

COMPOSER'ALIGHT'



TIMOTHY COGHILL

Timothy Coghill is a Melbourne based composer, producer and drummer. Born in Melbourne, Australia, and raised in a family of accomplished musicians, Timothy was encouraged to pursue music from a young age. While learning the clarinet and drum kit as a child, Timothy developed a fascination with the creation of music, spending hours making music on the family computer.


Having completed an Advanced Diploma on the drum kit at Melbourne Polytechnic, Coghill's early professional life was spent as a session drummer, performing and recording with artists such as Matt Corby, Tina Arena, Samsaruh, Dylan Joel, Harry Angus and many more. However, with that same childhood urge to get out the music that was inside him, Timothy went back to study, gaining a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Interactive Composition at The VCA.

Applying early experience in film and commercial scoring, Timothy began recording his original works, with early releases 'Beforwards' (2012) and 'Inside a Moment' (2013) being followed up by his debut album 'Nowhere' (2016).

Timothy's live performances of his original work have gathered somewhat of a cult following in the Melbourne independent scene. Set everywhere from clubs, to backyards, to churches, the 'Cinematic' series - featuring orchestral and contemporary musicians performing his compositions - has inspired and enchanted over the past nine years. His productions are often thematic meditations on the human condition in relation to its surroundings, and are immersive, atmospheric partnerships between light and sound.

Timothy has been commissioned for chamber ensembles such as Opus House and the Hobart Chamber Orchestra, by film directors such as Alexei Mizin and Max Walter, and for contemporary bands such as The Paper Kites, Samsaruh, Dylan Joel and many more

DARCY GOODALL

Originally from Christchurch New Zealand, Darcy trained extensively in gymnastics and various styles of dance from the age of 13. In 2017, Darcy moved to Melbourne where he trained at Jason Coleman's Ministry of Dance in 2018 and was awarded a 2nd year scholarship. His performance credits include; White Night Melbourne, Channel 10s 'Dancing with the Stars', Victoria Racing Club, Deakin & RMIT University, AFL Footy Show & many more. 
ABOUT

RUN TIME: 24 mins

SYNOPSIS:

As the two groups of dancers work towards a collective performance, can they surmount their differences to create something cohesive and wonderful? Or, will they choose to build walls to divide themselves?

Placing sharp, stylised jazz lines against loose and free contemporary movement, this fun and lighthearted piece is a commentary on the ever increasing polarisation of society.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

This work stemmed from two questions I wanted to explore: "What if Bob Fosse choreographed with contemporary movement?" and "Why do people keep trying to tell me my work must be either jazz or contemporary?"

I began by rewatching famous works by the great jazz choreographers like Bob Fosse and Jerome Robbins and trying to capture the essence of their styles. Then I layered the jazz and contemporary movements over each other while trying to create a harmonious balance of clashing and complimenting movements. The whole piece has a bit of a West Side Story flavour and it's been such a fun process to see this vibrant and quirky vision I had spring to life on such a talented cast.

It's been an enjoyable challenge to set both styles on stage at the same time. For a 25min show, there is essentially an hour's worth of choreography as each group has a completely different track that needed to be choregraphed.

RUN TIME: 24 mins

COMPOSER: Timothy Coghill

SYNOPSIS:

This work explores the crippling nature of loneliness.

"I felt as though I was floating in a sea of lights - looking out as everyone else lived their perfects lives and I hid away in the background. I felt like I was nowhere. I felt invisible in my pain and loneliness. So I pushed everyone away.

It wasn't until I started sharing about my pain and letting people in that I realised I wasn't alone. I began to realise that others were suffering too and so we made an effort to be together. What we found was that meaningful connection was the remedy for our loneliness.

Everyone is just searching for connection and meaning."

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

This is an incredibly personal piece for me to be sharing in such a public context, as it comes from my own struggles with loneliness. On top of that, this is the first time in Lion Heart's 5 year history that I am taking to the stage in one of our shows; to say I'm nervous would be an understatement! I hardly ever put myself out there as a performer any more, but I felt it was important to be vulnerable and address this subject matter head on.

Chronic loneliness is one of the greatest public health crises we are facing. I in 4 Australians reported feeling lonely each week, I in 2 sometimes or always feel alone and 30% of Australians said they don't belong to a social group. The most at risk people are the elderly and those aged 16-25.

Chronic loneliness increases your mortality rate by 26%. It's the equivalent of smoking 15 cigarettes a day! It's associated with higher levels of stress, social anxiety and depression and can contribute to heart disease and other chronic health conditions.

I believe we each have a responsibility to address loneliness in the world around us and I hope this work encourages you to reach out to someone in your world.






