

The hall stands on the site of a Benedictine priory dating back to the 1100s. In 1606 Sir Cuthbert Clifton of Westby acquired the land to build the first Lytham Hall. Much of the original Jacobean hall still exists, and was incorporated into the rear of the later Georgian design. The Georgian hall you see today was commissioned by Thomas Clifton in 1752, and built by renowned architect John Carr of York.

The colourful Clifton's reign here in Lytham spanned across four centuries and they left many historical legacies. They were immensely generous to Lytham and its surrounding areas, and shaped much of the Fylde we see today.







However, their fortunes changed and in the 1960s the hall was sold due to crippling debts.

Since the late 1990s the hall has been held in trust. The costs of upkeep and restoration, as you can imagine, are immense and our charity needs your help...
