

Hint: Steve Jobs loved that fruit.






Question 4






Hint: Sometimes the question seems difficult but the answer is simple




Answer: As many times as you like. (The answer to the division will always be 14.491297, no matter how many times you carry out the operation)

Answer: '45' | 45th US president




Read the following passage:



Where on Earth was the hottest-ever outdoor temperature recorded?



On board which fictional ship would you find the crew member Montgomery Scott?




Answer: The USS Enterprise
