Arches Academy is an independent private school, formed in June 2012 by licensed professional teachers who had been teaching and sculpting their curriculum together for over 20 years. We welcome a student body comprised of preschool through ninth graders, from various Utah communities and many countries of the world, as well as from a wide spectrum of socio-economic backgrounds. This diversity of talents, perspectives, cultures, and voices are integral to the Arches Academy experience; it defines the student ecology from which our teachers cultivate and nurture unparalleled student growth and creative achievement.

We are a student-focused, teacher-managed school where interactive learning empowers kids. At Arches, we understand that real-life intriguing experiences, fostered by instructors who are masters of their craft, can never be replaced by mindless drill or Internet babysitting because the teacher makes the difference. Our students are nurtured through their most formative years through interactions with encouraging teachers, supportive peers, intriguing material, and fascinating educational landscapes-both in and out of the classroom. Each student participates fully in our academically solid,

well-rounded liberal arts curriculum in Math, Science,

STUDENT BO

Populating a school or classroom should not be left to chance. However, public and charter schools are limited in their ability to select and control their student body. As a result, these schools that begin with a good reputation often become magnets for parents looking for a solution for their struggling child. Over time, these dynamics can drive serious students and teachers away, leaving the school to languish in the afterglow of its former reputation.

Arches Academy maintains its independence as a private school precisely to avoid these problems and maintain control over, among other things, its student body. Every year we carefully consider applications and accept only those students who meet set standards and who are assets to the student body in their own unique ways. This careful crafting, which includes maintaining small class sizes, admitting a percentage of qualified international students, and awarding financial aid to enable rich student diversity, is critical for Arches to create its ideal learning environment and achieve its educational mission.

SMALL CLASS SIZES

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Some parents don't realize the real dangers of over-loaded teachers and large class sizes that weigh down our public and charter schools. As the number of students grows beyond twenty, the ability of even the best teachers to manage their classes is increasingly at the mercy of unruly and difficult students. These students make it more difficult for a teacher to attract and maintain the group's attention, or to be more creative in their teaching approach. The loss of learning time can be staggering.

Let's do the math: If, in a 40 minute lesson, it takes 10 minutes to settle down instead of a few minutes, and various disruptions waste another 5-8 minutes, students lose about 25-33% of the learning time. When this happens day after day, a child effectively loses the equivalent of 1 educational year every three to four years.



In addition to this loss of learning time, serious, wellbehaved students can and do become invisible. When so much of a teacher's energy is spent on classroom management, even the best teachers aren't able to really understand the individual needs of their students. At best, teachers in large classrooms hope to "get through" a curriculum or "cover" material. The idea of deeply understanding each student—knowing their interests, how they are inspired, where they are challenged, how they think and make sense of their world, and how to help each one discover their own unique voice—is simply not feasible.

Why small class sizes? Because every child matters.

A school should nurture a climate in which the worth of each individual is continually affirmed, and in which students can have meaningful experiences in a stimulating environment where they feel safe, valued, inspired, and challenged.

According to the Utah State Office of Education, the average elementary school class size in 2013 was 25 students per class. For secondary courses like language arts, science, and math, the average class size was 30 students per class. (See "Statewide Report 2012-2013" at <u>www.</u> <u>schools.utah.gov/data/Reports/Class-Size.</u> <u>aspx.</u>) At Arches Academy, our average class size in 2015 was 13 students per class.

In our sensibly sized classes, students receive individualized attention and experiences that challenge each one based on their specific needs. Our safe and nurturing environment empowers students to take new steps to excel academically, socially, and emotionally. Their success is also centered on the combination of three essential elements:

- The child's positive attitude, effort, and ability,
- Support and involvement of home and community, and
- A nurturing, encouraging, creative teacher dedicated to reaching each individual.

Due to our small, child-focused classrooms we are better able to build and strengthen each of these elements to impact a child's education in powerful and positive ways.

GLOBAL PERSPECTIVE SMALL, BUT NOT SMALL-MINDED

Nothing says Utah more than Delicate Arch National Monument. Arches Academy is proud of its Utah heritage and to represent the best in a Utah education.

One of the most interesting aspects of Utah is its small-town feel among a surprisingly internationally-oriented people. Arches Academy works to preserve this character in its education by nurturing a global perspective among its students.

Arches Academy is a SEVIS certified school (Student and Exchange Visitor Information System) legally authorized to issue I-20 documents enabling foreign nationals to obtain student visas. We have welcomed students from Korea, Japan, China, Brazil, Australia, Germany, and the United Kingdom. Our carefully selected student body helps create an exchange of cultures, languages, and philosophies.

The core curriculum at Arches is designed with an eye to global understanding, including activities like a Geography Bee, international music and art appreciation, environmental awareness and global responsibility, current events, fundraising for Operation Smile and other global outreach programs, etc. Our Middle School program features Model United Nations, a class where students take on a foreign country persona and compete with other teams to solve real world problems using their understanding of geography and current events. Students also learn a foreign language and participate in a weekly countries and cultures "Round Table" class, where students from the different foreign language classes, including ESL, teach the rest of the student body about their country of focus or origin. Arches Academy graduates leave with a love and respect of global cultures balanced with a pride for their own local heritage.

Arches Academy creates uniquely crafted learning activities that offer students an educational experience like no other. A number of factors enable us to do this, including sensible class sizes, curricular freedom from state mandates, and creative professional teachers.

Some private schools use similar flexibility to drive a particular religiously oriented agenda to train their students. At Arches, we believe that religious education is so important and personal that it should never be separated from the home and family. As a result, we seek to create an environment that can be an effective complement to such home education, a place where students from a variety of religious and non-religious backgrounds will feel safe and respected in their religious and non-religious expression.

This intimate and safe environment enables a culture of intellectual curiosity and wonder that is the life-breath of Arches. With it, our proficient teachers are able to guide students through our strong, balanced curriculum, including a special focus on leadership development, all based on our unique perspective of education driven by interactive learning.

INTERACTIVE LEARNING

At Arches, worksheets or the Internet will never babysit your student. Here they will search for their own fossils at Dinosaur National Park, reenact the Battle of Gettysburg on the school green, snorkel Catalina Island to explore marine ecology, walk the Boston Freedom Trail to better understand our country's beginnings, explore how secret codes are created and use them to find information and treasure, and perform their favorite book as a self-written and self-directed play.

We believe that students learn best through real-life, intriguing experiences. With our manageable-sized student body, we are able to go on many fieldtrips, several of which are chaperoned overnight trips to exciting locations, or even out of state to broader educational landscapes. Our fieldtrips, whether local or more exotic, are always related to the students' current studies and projects, and are designed to provide hands-on, live experiences that enhance and solidify their learning.

We also believe that students are more motivated and thrive when they are given ownership of their education. Arches provides ample opportunities for students to shape their schooling by choosing from generous course offerings, electives, and our unique "mini courses" created specifically around students' interests. In these dynamic courses, students create their own projects and set goals for themselves with parental and teacher support.

MINI COURSES:

At Arches Academy, teachers work closely with students to personalize learning. One way we customize is through crafting unique mini-courses that inspire students and nurture their intrinsic curiosity. These courses are created using the results from student interest surveys, and are taught by teachers, parent experts, or other specialists. Courses usually run for 4-6 weeks, with several courses being offered at once. Students choose between the different courses to shape their own learning experiences. Topics are as diverse as our students, ranging from mummies, rock band performance, weaving, and cooking, to survival skills, archery, explorations in science/technology/ engineering/math, skiing, architecture, and more.





Mini-courses are not just about inspiring student interests. They also become vehicles for expert teachers to integrate important and often difficult educational ideas into a student's worldview. For example:

- Archery isn't just learning a sport, it also tells a story about potential and kinetic energy, aerodynamics, and an age of chivalry and myths.
- Spies and Codes is more than hideand-go-seek and cipher games; it also connects to the mathematics of cryptography, the chemistry of invisible ink, and a rich history, dating before the ancient Greeks.

In an Arches mini-course, students enjoy topics of particular interest to them, while also gaining additional knowledge in core subjects like math, science, history, and literature.

GIFTED AND TALENTED MODEL:

At Arches, we've observed that every student is equipped with innate learning strategies and talents. We recognize, train, and enhance these talents in order to empower students to achieve their highest potential in core academic subjects and beyond. We follow the gifted and talented model with every student, not just a few who "test in." This means that all students are encouraged to follow their passions and pursue projects that excite them, even topics that go above and beyond a state curriculum. These projects are often team endeavors and are always nurtured by the coaching and guidance of a capable teacher.

The G&T approach enables students to participate in a wide range of enrichment activities. Many activities are teacherselected and directed, chosen carefully to expose students to a wide variety of disciplines, topics, occupations, hobbies, persons, places, and events that would not ordinarily be included in the regular curriculum. Teachers invite guest speakers, travel on many fieldtrips, and integrate films, plays and other special performances. These activities are designed to spark interests that lead to *student-selected* learning and projects.

STRONG, BALANCED CURRICULUM

At Arches Academy, students don't fit the programs—we carefully create our programs to best fit our students. We use state core curriculum as a springboard, rather than a ceiling of what to accomplish in any given school year, teaching above and beyond minimum or mediocre, rigid standards. At Arches, student learning is not restricted or shaped by a standardized test; we never spend time "teaching to the test" as often happens in some schools. Rather, our assessment mechanisms zero-in on students' current academic levels and give teachers valuable feedback they use to individualize the design of learning experiences and ensure progress. Our Solid Core paired with rich elective offerings and targeted assessment delivers a balanced learning experience for wellrounded, well-educated graduates; students who are prepared for higher education and hold a lifelong thirst for learning.

We also employ a unique leveling approach to determine a student's placement in core subjects rather than just their birth date alone. We believe every student has the right to learn at their own level, so we assess to find out what students already know and what they are ready to learn next. During our morning core subject periods, students attend different math and language arts levels based on their assessed ability.

As students engage our unique core curriculum, they develop critical thinking skills and demonstrate competencies in the key areas of listening, speaking, reading, writing, mathematical foundations, and computational thinking. Our teachers foster curiosity and a balanced intellectual appetite in each of these subject areas. Our success is evident in part by our test scores.

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ENGLISH AND BALANCED LITERACY

Students in PK-5 learn to read, write, spell, speak, listen, and create through our Balanced Literacy program. Our literacy teachers truly love reading and carefully select books that will capture the attention of their students and inspire a genuine appreciation for great literature. Students learn through song, rhymes, reader's theater, poetry, technology, class games, interactive centers, captivating read-alouds, and daily reading and writing instruction tailored to each student's level. Students receive a high level of personalized support, enabling them to quickly progress to more advanced levels of reading and literacy development.

Middle School English Core and Communications classes provide the components necessary for students to become masters of written and oral communication. History, science, and current events are integrated into their reading and writing course work. Students are able to think deeply about literature themes in their book groups. Lively discussion and debate are a norm in our literature circles, where everyone participates and contributes to the conversation. Students create reports and other types of presentations to express their thoughts and knowledge of the topics they've engaged.

Arches Academy students are great readers and writers! Arches has consistently been a top reading school in the Utah Jazz Reada-thon, and students love the rewards: a school visit from a Jazz basketball player, a television and newspaper spotlight, and the wall-size, student-created graph depicting their total minutes read. We also host an annual Writing Rally featuring visits from well-known Utah authors and writing workshops throughout the rally week. Each student then applies their newly honed skills to create their own book! Books are published by a professional printer and shared in an author signing and book sharing event.





WORLD CLASS MATHEMATICS

The Founders of Arches knew that in order to create a world-class school, they needed the best math program in the world. As they examined over a decades' worth of research with the Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS), one of the largest world-wide studies evaluating math programs, they found that Singapore consistently ranked highest across the grades. They looked deeper at the Singapore math curriculum, and discovered the secret to being ranked #1:

Singapore Math focuses on mastery, not memorization. Usually you can divide students into two groups: those who "get" math, and those who "don't." Singapore Math teaches visualization strategies that people who "get" math naturally possess, to the students who "don't", leveling the playing field and giving all students the tools to think like a mathematician. The sequence of topics in Singapore math has also been carefully constructed, based upon child development theory, to include a pictorial approach which is often missing in other programs. Students are able to solidify their understanding as they visualize and then draw math concepts as a representative picture.

"One of my favorite things about Arches is their Singapore math curriculum. It focuses on learning math concepts in a three-step process: concrete, pictorial, and abstract. Concepts are learned on a much deeper level. My daughter's "math sense" has improved dramatically. She can solve problems she hasn't seen before because she can dissect them and figure out what they are really asking. HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

History is not a dead, read-about-itin-a-textbook kind of subject at Arches Academy. Rather, it comes alive for students as they re-enact a Civil War battle on the school green, transform their classroom into a native American village, create Viking helmets and shields, or set foot on actual sites which our forefathers walked. Students write historical fiction. keep a journal as a persona from a historical period, and portray their knowledge through wax museums or self-written plays. We use the Core Knowledge program to guide the curriculum for our history and geography classes, and teachers enrich the curriculum by integrating current events, global issues, fieldtrips, and literature and art from time periods and areas of the world for each unit they embark upon.

SCIENCE

Hands-on learning and understanding processes is the key to our strong Science curriculum. The Core Knowledge content is enhanced with live demonstrations, active student experiments, building of models, and fieldtrips to intriguing educational landscapes such as the planetarium, aquarium, BYU Bean museum, rock quarry, and more. Our science teachers are experts in their field and employ a variety of teaching methods, activities, and scientific materials to engage student attention, inspire their curiosity, and increase their desire to ask questions and seek answers. Students learn the Scientific Method and apply each step as they participate in our annual Science Fair. The majority of our students become so jazzed about the sciences they opt to take the additional enrichment offerings in the areas of STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics. Robotics, Advanced Technology, Math competitions, regional science fairs, Entrepreneurs, and 3-D printing are a few classes and options available for our aspiring young minds.

Our rigorous core academic offerings are enhanced with specialty classes that are often not offered in other schools. At Arches, students can choose from a variety of elective offerings that enhance students' learning experiences:

FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Students have many opportunities to engage in learning foreign languages and broadening their global perspective. Each student is able to choose between French, Spanish, or German, with our International students enrolled in English (ESL). Classes are leveled with mixed age groupings and meet 2-4 times per week. We integrate the use of technology to enhance and personalize learning.

Our unique Countries and Cultures "Round Table" assemblies encourage cultural exchange and appreciation. In these assemblies, students in Language Classes rotate the opportunity to share what they've learned with their peers through games, activities, food, music, current issues, history, and holidays from countries around the world. Students apply and develop their leadership skills as they teach other students, and learners gain more knowledge, appreciation and respect for the diverse beauty of our world's population.

FINE ARTS: MUSIC, ART, AND DRAMA

Arches Academy understands the brain balancing power of integrating Fine Arts classes into the required course load for students. Research shows that students who study the fine arts are 4 times more likely to be recognized for academic achievement in math, reading, and science and 3 times more likely to be awarded for school attendance. New brain research shows that not only does a Fine Arts education improve skills in math and reading, but it promotes creativity, social development, personality adjustment, and self-worth.

Our Fine Arts classes include General Music, Drama, Dance, and Art Fundamentals, as well as several other electives. Students learn about great artists from around the world, and experience performing and showcasing their own masterpieces as well. All Arches students participate yearly in a formal choral concert, a show choir style performance, a national art contest, an art museum display, and a musical theater production directed by professionals from the Scera Theater.

We take pride in our Fine Arts Faculty who are experts in their field. Their passion for the arts is contagious, and students naturally develop art appreciation as they are inspired by these professional teachers. As evidence of their high caliber teaching, our students consistently win national and regional art, theater, and music competitions.

Field Trips also expand our students' appreciation for the Fine Arts. Students have attended orchestra performances at Abravenal Hall, participated in a state-wide choral performance, toured art museums, and visitied local university performances to inspire them beyond the walls of the classroom. Students leave Arches wellrounded, with an impressive fine arts resume.

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PHYSICAL EDUCATION, DANCE, YOGA, KARATE

We offer a physical education program that focuses on lifetime fitness and wellness and that promotes creativity, self-discipline and accountability. We use a variety of tactics including the following:

- Creative movement
- Cooperative learning—"team-work"
- Sports and other competitive games—students learn good sportsmanship and how to cheer others' efforts in positive ways
- Collaborative group efforts (students design and implement their own activities and ultimately teach the entire group)
- Independent work to develop personal physical skills
- Fitness at home (journals, calculating nutrition, etc.)

EXTRACURRICULAR SPORTS

Arches Academy's main purpose in running a sports program is to provide additional opportunities for building team-work and synergy and to further develop individual athletic skills. Our coaches implement the following mottos to accomplish our vision:

• "We win as a team, we lose as a team." The teammates support each other 100%. In the fall of 2015, the middle school volleyball team consisted of both experienced and new students. It was essential for each player to find ways to build another's self-confidence as they learned and grew together as a team.

- "The way you practice is the way you'll play in a game." Students learn quickly of the need to focus and work hard during practice—that 100% dedication during practice leads to triumphs when it matters most. These lessons translate into other facets of students' lives.
- "How you play matters more than if you win." Students know that their success isn't only determined by the final score; rather it is about giving their all. Success means being better today than yesterday, not simply the number of victories.
- "Visualize yourself succeeding." As students imagine themselves succeeding rather than falling short, they gain confidence and self-mastery resulting in more frequent and larger achievements.



SYNERGY -

The arch is created when two sides come together, achieving a common goal neither can reach alone.

Incorporating the proven principle-based 7 Habits, this program helps students develop positive character traits and to act as leaders in their school, homes, and communities. Students learn to apply the 7 Habits in their everyday lives, and are able to see their own powerful potential as they do so. Arches Academy utilizes this superior program to provide clear and easy-to-use tools that help shape our student's habits and attitudes on a personal level, and their abilities to interact and work successfully on a social level.

Students have many opportunities to utilize this leadership training daily. They take initiative in planning group projects, class activities, fundraising for various causes, and more. They see a need for a cool club and create it, or recognize the value of team sports and jump in to participate, and invite others to do the same. They make proactive choices to clean up an area that needs attention, to help a fellow student out of a difficult situation, to take action when they see it is needed. STUDENT GOVERNMENT

Student Government is an excellent opportunity for students to further develop their leadership skills. Students run for office, and once elected, really put the 7 Habits to work. They "Begin With the End in Mind" by creating a vision for the school and what kind of impact they want to have as leaders. That vision guides them as they "synergize" to create fun and unique experiences for the student body. Officers learn organization and delegation skills as they plan parties, service projects, school assemblies, and more. Students plan, organize, and execute all activities on their own, with their teacher as coach and facilitator. These activities strengthen their leadership skills, deepen their relationships, and build lasting friendships in school and throughout the world. In 2013 the Student Government organized a "smile-raiser" to support Operation Smile. In 2014, students planned a "penny war" which raised over \$1,000 for local families in need at Christmas time. This year they have been involved in gathering items to help refugees. Our Student Government members become aware of local and global needs and take initiative to be part of the solution. They certainly gain skills and self-confidence to succeed as leaders.

STUDENT MENTORS

Students learn from one another as they are connected with each other for various activities. 'Reading Buddies' creates the opportunity for older students to be mentors; to have the experience of setting good examples and caring for others. Younger students have someone they can trust and look up to and 'high-five' in the hallway. 'Study-buddies' are peers who support each other to succeed in their classes. They understand that each individual has strengths and weaknesses; that sometimes we lead, and sometimes we follow and learn. All students are encouraged to reach out to those they don't know well, to include rather than exclude, and to cheer each other on as classmates try new things and stretch to meet their goals. All of our students have daily opportunities to mentor another.

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A carefully crafted student body and a collection of uniquely constructed learning experiences are two pillars of an Arches education. Nevertheless, this education only comes together when a proficient teacher of real caliber is able to use his or her creative expertise to bridge the pillars, forming a gateway to student growth and achievement.

TEACHER MANAGED, STUDENT CENTERED

Every school makes efforts to hire the best teachers available, but even the finest teacher's hands can be tied by the governmental bureaucracies controlling public and charter schools. When a one-size-fits-all curriculum is enforced and then measured with extensive standardized testing, even the greatest teachers are limited to only presenting the mandated curriculum-no matter how ineffective it may be-and find themselves trading precious instruction time for test preparation. Coupled with the problems of oversized classrooms and budget constraints of an underfunded system restricting supplies, activities, fieldtrips, and other resources, even exceptional teachers find it hard to be their best.

Arches Academy was designed, founded, and is administered by teachers, a unique business model and vision of an exceptional faculty empowered to use their expertise to inspire, instruct, and interact meaningfully with their students. As a private school, we are exempt from government mandates on curriculum and assessment. Teachers un-fettered by standard scripts and mandated curriculum can apply their expertise to teaching students, not a "class" or a

curriculum. Using the state curriculum as a springboard, rather than a ceiling, our teachers are free to integrate the latest best validated practices, the individual needs and interests of their current students. parent feedback, and local educational offerings to design personalized education fit specifically for their current students. They teach above and beyond set standards or tests, promoting excellence in each individual regardless of a student's starting point. No child is given less attention because they are doing "just fine." Rather, students at all levels of learning are supported and encouraged by creative, caring, exceptional teachers to progress, thrive, and enjoy their education.

EMPOWERED, DEDICATED, INVOLVED

This empowering environment attracts the most dedicated teachers, teachers interested in being able to use their talents and expertise to reach students and shape education in beneficial ways. Teachers partner to help manage all aspects of the school, and partners share responsibility for the success of the school as whole. As a result, they focus not only on their own classroom, but collaborate to follow students' progress across classes and through the years. Partners think carefully about which students to admit and retain, and limit class size to ensure that every teacher can be effective and achieve the educational vision they establish with each and every student and their parents.

Senior partners also serve on the Board, enabling them to help grow and protect the financial resources needed to fulfill their educational vision. Instead of being limited by an administration or governmental

Some teachers have capitalized on their Arches experience to apply to or pursue graduate programs at top universities such as Georgetown and Harvard.

It is these kinds of teachers—teachers with real expertise and deep understanding, teachers that are free to adapt their methods to the needs of specific students, teachers that are incentivized to work as a team to create a comprehensive learning environment—that bridge a carefully crafted student body with uniquely constructed learning experiences. At Arches, teachers make the difference. "What could a great school teach a child if the school effectively uses the hours the child is there? Arches Academy is a school full of administration and teachers that love to teach and love what they do. If you imagine what great educators are and what great educators do, I think that would describe the staff at Arches. They are emotionally committed to the school and the children—they aren't just punching the clock or counting the days until retirement.

Arches uses leveled learning so if your child is ahead or behind in a core subject, they will receive teaching at the level that is appropriate for them. Students receive exposure to more topics/classes because the teachers effectively use their time. The administration asks for parent input on curriculum, on what is going well, and on what may need improvement. If I come in the building to pick up my kids, the teachers are in the school and proactively stop to talk with me about my children. I don't have to wait for a parent teacher's conference.

I know what my kids do at school. I used to joke that I was going to strap a GoPro camera to my son's head so I could see what was going on at his last school. I know the staff by name and they know my name. Since the school is small, I likely already know the teacher my child will have next year. I don't have to worry and hope that my kids get"the good teacher"like other schools.
