In our municipality we have a department that allows us to get a smooth start to preschool as possible for the new parents and their children

The mapping call creates predictions for preschool to give the newly arrived child a good introduction. And for a new arrivals, children will have the same opportunities as children in families established in Sweden for a long time.

Mapping is an important tool for getting to know the child.



In our preschool we find it important that all children feel respected and important. Integration deals with everyone's equal rights, obligations and opportunities regardless of ethnic and cultural backgrounds and about living together with respect for each other's differences.

All children are entitled to their own native language

We pay attention to the children's different needs during the day. When the children come to us for the first time, we use the interpreter in their own language. It makes it easier for all parties to understand our preschool

When the child comes the first day we gather everyone and tell them from which country the child is from. We have done some research about the country

For help, we have our Ipad as we connect to the television so everyone can look at the pictures and facts we found on the internet. Here we have found a fairy tale in Arabic.



Prior to us hosting all of our partners we prepared the children for having special guest.



Here we tell the children about the visit we will have from our partner countries. Which countries it is, and what they speak for languages.

We show the map where the countries are located. How their flag looks and what they speak for languages.

We also prepared similar materials and informations for the schools our partners visited so their children will feel more comfortable with the visitors.



In our theme "Birds", the children have been given the task of drawing a bird. As a part of exploring birds we organized walks in the forest, parks and bird parks.

The children explain in English and Swedish to the Arab girl what she should do. It is natural for our children to take care of and explain to the girl


Organized outgoing activities

To give our partners a better sense of what kind of organized activities we prepare and take our children to we decided to take our partners there to experience it themselves. We believe that in that way they would experience first hand what kind of activities take place in such events and what do children get from it.

We took partners to WANÅS CASTLE as an example of an organized trip for younger children and to BÄCKASKOG CASTLE as an example of an organized visit for school children – usually for the end of the year.



WANÅS CASTLE



Wanås castle oldest parts originate from the 1400s. During the Nordic Seven Years War 1563-1570 devastated and burned the main building of the Swedish troops, but was restored by Steen Bille around 1566. The castle got its present appearance at the rebuilding in 1900. Manor avenues and the castle pond, and the English park and the orangery was built around 1800. Garden was known in 1440 century named *Watnaasridge* in the water. It then belonged to Squire Eskil Åkesson. In the late 1400s and early 1500s belonged Wanås family Brahe. Their loyalty to the deposed Christian II led to the estate were drawn into the Danish krone, which in 1525 sold it to Claus Bille. From his family came Wanås by purchasing the governor Malte Juul's widow Anna Ramel. The donation went to the Castle of the Pomeranian family von Putbus. 1756 was purchased Wanås of governor Carl Axel Hugo Hamilton (Born 1722, 1763 death). His widow Betty born Jennings did Wanås the entailed estate for his grandson, Count Carl Axel Wachtmeister of Johannishus which took over the estate in 1801. The same family still owns the estate, but the estate is now closed down since last fideikommissarien Cabinet Chamberlain Count Gustaf Wachtmeister of Johannishus died in 1978. BÄCKASKOG CASTLE

about the castle

Bäckaskog castle is a restaurant, hotel and conference center located about 15km northeast of Kristianstad. To Malmo and the Oresund Bridge, the distance is not more than about 10mil.

The fresh air, biodiversity and the historical-cultural background has made Bäckaskog Castle into one of southern Sweden's most popular tourist destinations.

On a narrow isthmus between two sparkling lakes monks chose to build his monastery in the mid-1200s. The Danes made the monastery into a fortress in 1584 and in the 1800s transformed the King Charles XV Bäckaskog Castle to the country house where he had any withdrew.

To visit Bäckaskog Castle is to travel in time and space.
