Welcome to the 33nd annual Green River Festival!

This summer marks the 50th anniversary of the landmark **Woodstock Music & Arts Festival.** After five decades, that magic happenstance of hippies, music, and mud is the first thing that comes to mind when you use the term "music festival." It should have been a disaster, but instead it's remembered as a watershed moment in American music culture – the first real music festival. Subsequent attempts at recreating the magic with anniversary festivals have failed miserably. A 50th anniversary festival planned for this summer has crashed and burned. Woodstock only happened once, but it spawned hundreds of music festivals.

Welcome to the **33rd annual Green River Festival.** Every year since 1986, we've taken over the fields of Greenfield Community College for our annual celebration of music, local culture and community. From the beginning, our goals have been a lot more modest than Woodstock, but the idea is the same: let's get our tribe together for a big midsummer party.

What keeps a festival going for over three decades? We'd like to think that our formula of great bands, a kid-friendly atmosphere, and excellent local food and drink keep you coming back. It helps that we have a beautiful festival site and the best audience anywhere. But to keep it fresh, you need surprises.

Every year we like to try something new to add the element of surprise. Last year, the addition of the **Green House Stage** brought us intimate, spur of the moment acoustic sets from some of our headliners. Imagine having **Michael Franti, Deer Tick** or **I'm With Her** perform on your patio. Who'll pop up on the Green House Stage this year? LUCINDA WILLIAMS

Just by sticking to her guns, Lucinda Williams spearheaded the creation of a musical genre. There wasn't Americana at the time. It is a little bit country and rock, and fell into the cracks,' Williams told Billboard magazine about her Rough Trade album called Lucinda Williams (1988.) On that disc Lucinda found her songwriting stride with exquisitely realized songs like "Passionate Kisses," 'Crescent City", and "Side of the Road". Every song was a model of compression and detail delivered with her languid Louisiana drawl. The Rough Trade album was a cult classic, but her breakthrough album came ten years later with Car Wheels on a Gravel Road. That album won her the first of three Grammies. When Lucinda Williams played Green River in 2008, she invited a couple who had gotten married at the festival that day to come on stage and dedicated a song to them.



HEATHER MALONEY

In 2014 Singer-songwriter Heather Maloney got some big love from the New York Times for her sublime cover of Joni Mitchell's "Woodstock" that she recorded with Darlingside. Like Joni, Heather is a musical adventurer, vocal acrobat and creative soul. For her new album *Soil in the Sky*, Heather took forty new songs on tour and had the audiences vote for their favorites. Seven out of 10 top vote-getters made the album which she recorded with guests like Rachael Price of Lake Street Dive and Taylor Goldsmith of Dawes. *Soil in the Sky* just came out in June. Last fall Heather wowed the crowd at the inaugura l **Arcadia Folk Festival**, which will be happening again in late September in Easthampton.

to join them in their vibrant musical lakou. This nine-piece collective joins guitars with call and response singing, voudou rhythms and troubadour accordion to create uplifting anthems. Formed in the aftermath of Haiti's devastating earthquake of 2010, Lakou Mizik is an intergenerational band of elder legends and rising young talents. The title cut to their album *Wa Di Yo* is a testament to their invincible spirit. "Wa di yo, nou la toujou ("You tell them, we're still here!")



LADAMA

The core four women of Ladama hail from Venezuela, Brazil, Columbia and the United States. Lara Klaus, Daniela Serna, Mafer Bandola and Sara Lucas met in 2014 through the One Beat Program, which brings together musical leaders around the globe. Incorporating traditional instruments like the bandola llanera and the pandeiro frame drum, Ladama makes exciting, rhythm-forward music in South American styles like cumbia, maracatu and onda nueva. Ladama also works on socially engaged projects in all four of their native countries to empower youth and women through music. As they say in their TED talk, Ladama "acts globally and thinks locally."

band- three harmonizing women vocalists like the early Pointer Sisters fronting a lively acoustic band with the drummer gleefully thumping a box-shaped drum- seat. They were so impressive that the next year they got a proper stage gig at the festival. This Hudson Valley band (formerly known as Upstate Rubdown) has retained that thrilling vocal sound with singers Mary Kenney, Melanie Glenn and Allison Olender. Their new album *Healing* was produced by Wood Brothers drummer Jano Rix.



LAKOU MIZIK

In Haitian the word "lakou" means backyard gathering place, home or "where you are from." Lakou Mizik invites listeners MTALI SHAKA Banda oneness Project

In 2017 saxophonist Mtali Shaka Banda released his debut album as a band leader *The Oneness Project: Rites of Passage.* A blend of jazz, hip-hop and

soul music the album features Mtali's strong sax work over bumpin' grooves like "The Vibe" and "Back in the Day." The son of Milawian refugee father and an African-American gospel choir director mother, Mtali grew up with lots of music in the house. After graduating from UMass with a concentration in jazz he toured with the Jeremy Turgeon Quartet and was featured at the 2018 Springfield Jazz & Roots Festival.

PARSONSFIELD

Parsonsfield's live shows have a contagious, frothy energy that can swing from a rowdy romp to a quiet hush. While lead-singer Chris Freeman bounces around the stage and keyboardist Max Shakun whips his curly locks to the beat, banjoist Antonio Alcorn stands calmly like he stepped out of a 19 th century daguerreotype. Everybody sings, everybody switches instruments, everybody gets in the spirit. On songs like "Weeds or Wildflowers" they sound like the Avett Brothers northern cousins. Based out of Leverett, MA, the band first came together at the University of Connecticut. Parsonsfield took their name from the rural town in Maine where they recorded their first album in 2013.

ANGÉLIQUE KIDJO: REMAIN IN LIGHT

"And you may find yourself, living in a shotgun shack," sings Angelique Kidjo from her re-imagined

album of the Talking Heads *Remain in Light* (2018.) "And you may find yourself, in another part of the world," sings Kidjo, the Benin-born singer based in Paris. "And you may ask yourself, how did I get here?" Kidjo got to Green River because she is a world music superstar who commands the stage with her leonine presence and commanding voice. She is also a human rights activist. Her Batonga Foundation empowers and educates the most excluded adolescent girls in Africa. Angelique Kidjo has collaborated with U2, Vampire Weekend and Dave Matthews. Her newest album *Celia* (2019) is a tribute to salsa legend Celia Cruz.



THE WOOD BROTHERS

The Wood Brothers make a lot of music for a trio. Chris Wood, of Medeski, Martin & Wood fame, is

such a talented, melodic bass player that he acts like another lead instrument while still anchoring the sound. Drummer Jano Ricks is a multiinstrumentalist who has a keyboard as part of his drum-kit. Lead-singer Oliver Wood plays percussive guitar and has a backwoods voice that rings through the valley. The Wood Brothers most recent album *One Drop of Truth* (2018) included wonderful songs like the cresting "River Takes the Town" and the funky "Happiness Jones." The Wood Brothers grew up in Boulder, CO and are now based Nashville. They played Green River in 2015.

LOW CUT CONNIE



There is just something about standing on a piano that is so rock 'n' roll. On "Late Night with Seth Myers" Adam Weiner of Low Cut Connie was standing on top of the piano before the song "All These Kids Are Way Too High" had even begun. A wild-man entertainer in the style of Little

Richard, Jerry Lee Lewis and early Elton John, band leader Adam Weiner is based out of Philadelphia. On tour he brings his \$100 beat-up piano called "Shondra" that "he treats like a pommel horse," says NPR. The band plays strong Stonesy rock 'n' roll or as their website calls it: "A New Boogie for All Mankind."



Childers, not only inherited a gritty vocal twang and an Appalachian point of view, he has a diamond-bright talent that makes him one of the most heralded new singer-songwriters in America. His 2017 album *Purgatory* is a brilliant collection of songs that bring to mind Hank Williams, John Prine and Sturgill Simpson, who co-produced the album. Childers (pronounced "Chill-derz") was discovered by TV viewers when his music was featured on Anthony Bourdain's "Parts Unknown" episode about West Virginia.



FISH Samantha Fish is the latest in a line of women blues singers who can wail on electric guitar. Following in the footsteps of people like Bonnie Raitt, Susan Tedeschi,

and Debbie Davies, Samantha knows her place on stage. "A woman with an instrument is in a position of power," said Ms. Fish in a recent interview. Winner of the 2018 Female Blues Artist of the Year at the Blues Music Awards, Samantha Fish also plays country ballads, Southern rock and sultry R&B. Growing up in Missouri, Fish, 30, learned at the feet of touring blues artists who performed at Knuckleheads Saloon in Kansas City. This spring she toured Europe and played a standout show at the New Orleans Jazzfest.



THE SUITCASE JUNKET Suitcase Junket is on a roll. In the past week

roll. In the past week alone, this one-man rock band from Leverett has performed at the High Sierra Music Festival north of Sacramento and the Mariposa Folk Festival north of Toronto. Touring

200 shows a year must be especially challenging for a guitarist who sits on a Rube Goldberg drum kit made out of recycled flotsam and jetsam that he plays with his feet. Mr. Junket (aka Matt Lorenz) has a terrific new album called *Mean Dog, Trampoline* on Signature Sounds produced by Steve Berlin of Los Lobos. Check out the wonderful stopmotion video for the song "High Beams" that brings to life Lorenz's extensive necktie collection.

TYLER CHILDERS

Rolling Stone describes Tyler Childers voice as "halfway between a confession and a holler." Growing up in the hollers of Eastern Kentucky coal country



PAMELA MEANS

To celebrate the 50th anniversary of *Abbey Road*, Pamela Means recently performed that whole Beatles

album, in order, solo, on acoustic guitar. Means has the skills and the artistic vision to pull off this kind of feat with aplomb. Best known for her folk music career she is also a fine jazz singer and social activist. Originally from Milwaukee, she moved to Boston and now lives in the Pioneer Valley. Curve magazine called her "one of the fiercest guitar players and politically rooted singer-songwriters in the music industry today." Her latest recording, the driving "Impeachment Now!" pulls no punches. "The president, is incompetent, an embarrassment, im-peach-ment now."



THE STONE COYOTES The Stone Coyotes are a family band that really rock. Songwriter Barbara Keith and her husband/drummer Doug Tibbles are joined by their sons John Tibbles and Doug Tibbles, Jr. on guitars. When this family gets together they play hard-driving guitars

that underscore the drama in Keith's vivid stories. Barbara Keith's more Americana songs have been covered by the likes of Patty Loveless ("The Bramble and the Rose,") Delaney & Bonnie ("Free the People") and Tanya Tucker ("The Pride of Franklin County.") Speaking of Franklin County, the band lives in Greenfield, MA and also in Los Angeles, where they were discovered by writer Elmore Leonard, who made them an integral part of his novel "Be Cool," the sequel to "Get Shorty."



SPANGLISH FLY

Spanglish Fly specializes in boogaloo, the music that originated in the Spanish Harlem music scene in the mid-sixties. Combining Afro-Cuban rhythms with American soul and English lyrics boogaloo was an easy Latin music on-ramp for gringos and super danceable for everybody. Ten years ago Spanglish Fly in NYC decided to revive boogaloo and expand its possibilities. This 11-piece band features double-lead vocalists and great tunes like their bolero/salsa cover of Amy Winehouse's "You Know I'm No Good/ Chica Mala Mambo." Estas ready for Spanglish Fly?

THE DEVIL MAKES THREE

When the Devil Makes Three played Green River in 2013, there were just three of themz: Pete Bernhard on guitar, Lucia Turino on upright bass and Cooper McBean on guitar and banjo. Based in Santa Cruz, CA, all three members of the band grew up in Vermont (Bernhard and McBean around Brattleboro.) Last year the band

added a fiddler and a drummer (Stefan Amidon, another Brattleboro guy.) The newest DMT release, Live at Red Rocks, 2019 is a collection of classic redemption and ruin songs like "Deep Down," which sounds like a jaunty old-time tune until you find yourself singing along, "Deep in my heart, I'm a terrible man." Like the band says, "If you're going to do wrong, buddy, do wrong right."



THE RECORD COMPANY

Chris Vos, the lead-singer and guitarist for The Record Company grew up on a dairy farm in new Munster, Wisconsin. When his wife got a job in L.A. they moved to California and Vos put an ad on Craigslist looking for like-minded musicians. Bassist Alex Stiff (originally from Wayne, PA) and drummer Marc Cazorla (Elmira, NY) showed up and they bonded over the

stripped down blues of John Lee Hooker and Canned Heat. Playing in small L.A. clubs the trio built a buzz and recorded an album in Vos's living room that was released by Concord Records in 2016. On songs like "I'm Getting Better (And I'm Feeling it Right Now)" The Record Company builds powerhouse grooves from the ground up.



RHIANNON GIDDENS

When Rhiannon Giddens performed at the Green River Festival in 2011 as part of the Carolina Chocolate Drops trio, she already had star power. Strumming a minstrel banjo, Giddens had the presence and resolute voice of '60s icons like Odetta and Joan Baez. Classically trained at Oberlin as a soprano, Giddens champions the African-American roots of string band music. Since 2011 she has released three solo albums, composed a ballet score and won a MacArthur genius award (2017.) This year she released the

Songs of Our Native Daughters album with three other black women banjo players and was featured in a four-night residency with the Boston Pops titled "Redefining American Music." Rhiannon Giddens grew up in rural North Carolina.



EILEN JEWELL

Eilen Jewell's forthcoming album Gypsy (due in August) sounds like her best record yet. The opening song "Crawl" could be a lost Creedence Clearwater Revival track with its trembling tremolo guitar. "You Cared Enough to Lie" is a classic Patsy Cline shuffle and "79 Cents" is Eilen channeling Loretta Lynn. "Whether she's rich

or toilin' in a ditch, no matter the color of her collar, the heart of your home, works her fingers to the bone, for 79 cents to your dollar." Raised in Idaho, Eilen spent a decade in the Boston Americana music scene where she joined forces with ace guitar-picker Jerry Miller. Eilen's clear-as-a-mountain-stream voice and Jerry's six-string fireworks are a classic combination.

THE EAST POINTERS

The East Pointers's music is laced with stuttered triplets- the stop-and-go picking that ripples through through Celtic music like the fluttering wings of a bird. Fiddler/singer Tim Chaisson and banjo-playing cousin Koady Chaisson



come from a clan of Prince Edward Island musicians going back seven generations. Joined by guitarist Jake Charron, the East Pointers won a Juno Award for their debut album Secret Victory in 2015 and followed that with the atmospheric alt-pop of the "What We Leave Behind". In concert, small shifts in their circulating rhythms feel crucial. When this virtuosic band flies into one of their soaring melodies, the audience flies with them.

FANTASTIC NEGRITO 6:15 DEAN'S BEANS STAGE

Fantastic Negrito is an amazing story. Born in the Berkshires, Xavier Amin Dhrepaulezz was the 8th of 15 children raised in a strict Somali-Caribbean household. At the age of 12 his family moved to Oakland, CA and Xavier got caught up in street crime. A near-death encounter with masked gunmen prompted

a move to L.A., where he got signed as Xavier to a \$1 million contract by Interscope Records. In 1999 a car accident left him in a coma for three weeks. He moved back to Oakland, immersed himself in blues music and became Fantastic Negrito. In 2015 he won NPR's first Tiny Desk Contest and in 2017 and 2019 his albums won Grammies for Best Blues recordings. Now Fantastic Negrito is back in Western Massachusetts to play the Green River Festival with his super-charged mix of blues, rock and soul.



THE SUFFERS

The Suffers are an eight-piece Gulf Coast Soul band from Houston, Texas who took their name from the reggae movie "Rockers." This spring the band suffered a terrible tribulation when their trailer full of gear was stolen in Dallas. Fortunately, a \$20,000 GoFundMe campaign reached its goal in two days and the band was able to

keep touring. The warm, groovin' music of the Suffers features the outstanding lead vocalist Kam Franklin riding percolating party jams like "Do Whatever," "Peanuts" and "Make Some Room." If you like to dance, here's a chance.



THE GASLIGHT TINKERS

Gaslight Tinkers call their music "the future of the music of the past." That mobius strip of a sentence resembles their musical approach. One of their audio adventures starts with fiddler Emerald Rae and guitarist Peter Siegel playing the rousing Celtic tune "Morrison's Jig." The rhythm section

adds a surprising reggae beat that morphs into a faster ska beat that flips over into the traditional "Bird's Nest." Just add a dancing audience and you've got a Gaslight Tinkers show. Along with Rae and Siegel, this Brattleboro band features Joe Fitzpatrick on drums, Garrett Sawyer on bass and I-Sha Irene Shaikly on percussion.



CEDRIC BURNSIDE

At the age of 10 Cedric Burnside started playing drums at house parties and juke joints in Northern Mississippi. When the police arrived, "They would hide us behind the beer coolers in the back," said Cedric in an interview. By age 13 Cedric was drumming at clubs with his grandfather R.L. Burnside, who spearheaded the

hill country blues wave with his albums on Fat Possum Records in the 1990s. After R. L. passed, Cedric has continued the family tradition of raw, hypnotic electric blues. Performing on both drums and guitars Cedric delivers powerful, in the moment blues, or as Cedric calls it, "feel music."

MIPSO

In 2017 Rolling Stone magazine dubbed Mipso an "Artist You Need to Know." Since their song "People Change" has now racked up 40 million Spotify plays, Mipso ipso facto, is getting well known. Based out of Chapel Hill, the band formed as undergrads at UNC. The band

features Joseph Terrell on guitar, Libby Rodenbough on fiddle, Jacob Sharp on mandolin and Wood Robinson on upright bass. Everybody sings with Terrell usually taking the lead. Mipso may look like a bluegrass band but their music leans more indie-folk. Inspired by their Scandinavian tour last

> fall they did a wonderful cover and video of "Call Your Girlfriend," the electro-pop hit by Robyn.

MAPACHE

Clay Finch and Sam Blasucci, were skateboard kids in Glendale, CA who discovered their singing voices made a gnarly blend. Now in their mid-twenties, Finch and Blasucci have formed an Americana duo called Mapache that features their glowing, sunset harmonies. Mapache rhymes with "catchy" and means raccoon in Spanish. The new Mapache EP, features gorgeous covers of songs by the Louvin Brothers, Tom Paxton and the New Riders of the Purple Sage ("Lonesome L.A. Cowboy.") Finch describes their West Coast music as, "A big sweep of the influences you encounter around here: folk and psychedelic and country and Latin and rock and cowboy and Hawaiian. We're drawing from a really deep well."



PHILIP B. PRICE

Philip B. Price is best known in these parts as the front-man of Winterpills, the dreamy folk-pop band hypnotizing audiences since 2003. Local fans also know that Price had another excellent harmony-driven rock band called The Maggies in the '90s, but it was not until 2018 with the back-catalogue release of 12 (!) solo albums did fans realize just how prolific this guy has been. A pop-music savant with a high-flying tenor voice, Price sparkles in every context. One of his songs "Freeze Your Light", was recently covered by the Young at Heart Chorus. He also plays in the

band Look Park with Chris Collingwood from Fountains of Wayne. A new solo album called *Bone Almanac*, his first project solo since 2004, will be out this October on Signature Sounds.

OUR COMMITMENT TO SUSTAINABILITY

Each year, The Green River Festival team deepens our commitment to sustainability and moving towards making the festival zero waste.

A team of 32 volunteers led by Montserrat Archbald, collects compost and recycling from bins across the festival grounds, hauls it back to our tent, removes any trash, and sorts it into different categories. Compost goes to Martin's Farm, recycling goes to the Greenfield DPW, and returnables are donated to a veterans' organization.

> GRF has been recycling since 2008 and composting since 2012.

In 2018, trash was reduced, and composting was increased by 1/2 ton! We composted 1.25 more tons than we trashed!

Thank you Martin's Farm for hauling all our compostables and Franklin County Solid Waste Management District (FCSWMD) for lending us composting and recycling equipment.
