We ask that competitors please be prepared to participate by reading **read the rules** listed on the website. Prior to the event footwear will be inspected and wives will be weighed.

The 'wife' must be a minimum weight of 49 kilograms. Please note the only equipment that can be used during the race is the provided helmet.

Music lovers can enjoy yoik, traditional chants of the Sámi language which act as a dialogue for traditional and modern Sámi culture.


