The following are 10 of the 78 Intel community DOJ FBI personnel who have key information. Some are willing to testify and some will have to be subpoenaed as they are hostile but are in a situation where they will have to tell the truth because they are in the middle of communication chains or are aware parties within their environment are testifying.

Because the DOJ OIG has these names, **some of whom are willing to testify and incontrovertible documentation along with a factual narrative that easily ties everything together**, and there is an abundance of irrefutable evidence about separate matters that has been submitted by our group repeatedly, criminal referrals should be issued against James Comey, Sally Yates, John Brennan, Rod Rosenstein, Loretta Lynch, Susan Rice and James Clapper, and parties who are yet to be disclosed.

Some pressure has been put on Bill Priestap, Samantha Power, Andrew McCabe, Peter Strzok, Stephen Rees and Bruce Ohr to testify, however, they will only come clean if they are in the DOJ venue facing potential criminal charges rather than Congressional hearings.

Also depending on the cooperation of David Bowdich and Paul Abbate concerning their knowledge of the activity of their department pertaining to the chain of communications about the instructions given to Stefan Halper to spy and interfere with the Trump Campaign, and overall communications between the DOJ, FBI, GCHQ and the Office of Net Assessment, and the FISA Court Applications, and the **improper classifying and redacting of information to cover up crimes**, additional criminal referrals have to be issued. Please see 10 of the 78 (so far) **but the right questions have to be asked.**

There are multiple required protocols, oversight departments and regular communication chains that have not been publicized such as the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) and National Security Division (NSD) to name two that have not been focused on but play a big role in irrefutably proving an internal conspiracy, obstruction of justice and perjury.

FURTHER THE PUBLIC MUST DEMAND FROM THE DOJ OIG MICHAEL HOROWITZ AND UNITED STATES ATTORNEY JOHN HUBER FULL TRANSPARENCY AS TO THE AMOUNT OF EVIDENCE THEY EACH HAVE RECEIVED, THE VERACITY AT WHICH THEY REVIEWED THE EVIDENCE, THE DISPOSITION OF THE EVIDENCE AND THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IDENTIFIED BY THE EVIDENCE, THE PARTIES WHO WERE CALLED IN TO TESTIFY, AND THE ACTION TAKEN, COMPARED TO THE NORMAL COURSE OF A FEDERAL INVESTIGATION.

In addition, there are clearly defined processes to record the activities of the investigations and the record keeping thereof.

36 CFR 1230.14 REQUIRES FEDERAL AGENCIES TO PROMPTLY REPORT TO NATIONAL ARCHIVES AND RECORDS ADMINISTRATION ANY UNAUTHORIZED **REMOVAL OR DESTRUCTION** OF RECORDS.

THERE HAS TO BE A DEMAND FOR A PUBLIC REVIEW OF THE INVESTIGATIVE AND PROSECUTORY STEPS TAKEN PER ATTORNEY, PER DEPARTMENT AND THE CORRELATING OVERSIGHT AND CHECKS AND BALANCES.

THE PRESIDENT SHOULD ISSUE AN EXECUTIVE ORDER TO FORM AN INTERNAL COMMITTEE TO REPORT DIRECTLY TO THE PRESIDENT WITH PARTICIPATION BY THE NSC, WITH THE POWER TO INSTRUCT EACH DIRECTOR, DEPUTY DIRECTOR, INSPECTOR GENERAL AND ATTORNEY OF EACH DEPARTMENT AS TO THEIR TASKS THEY MUST PERFORM PER REASONABLE SCHEDULE WITH A DAILY LOGUE AND WITH MULTIPLE PEOPLE WITHIN THE COMMITTEE OR EVEN NEW DEPARTMENT ESTABLISHED TO PERFORM A **DAILY REVIEW**.

Dear Mr. Rees:

The National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) has become aware of a possible unauthorized disposition of Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) records based on the letter dated January 20, 2018, sent to the FBI by the Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs. This letter (attached) outlines the potential loss of text messages from both agency-issued and personal devices as well as emails pertaining to FBI official business sent or received via personal, non-government accounts.

As required in 36 CFR 1230.14, Federal agencies must promptly report to NARA any unauthorized removal or destruction of records. Based on the letter referenced above and in accordance with 36 CFR 1230.16(b), NARA requests that FBI respond within 30 calendar days to the allegations that text messages, emails and other Federal records may have been lost or destroyed. In particular, the FBI should identify the scope and scale of all records, lost, destroyed, or otherwise alienated, as the Senate Committee requested in its letter of January 20, 2018, as well as the scope and results of any searches of personal devices or accounts conducted to determine whether Federal records remained extant. The response should also detail specific actions the FBI will take to address any failure to capture and preserve Federal records in a timely fashion, and the steps the FBI will take to mitigate future risk. Please indicate in your response if any records lost can be re-created or duplicated from other sources, or recovered from the appropriate email service providers.

We understand the Department of Justice Inspector General (IG) is conducting a review, and the full nature of the potential unauthorized disposition of records may not be resolved within 30 calendar days. With this in mind, we request any information you can provide regarding our inquiry within the 30 calendar days and then future updates as appropriate. In addition, we request a copy of the final IG report, and copies of future responses to the Senate Committee on this matter to the extent they implicate the Federal Records Act. We look forward to receiving your final report satisfying the above requirements upon conclusion of the IG investigation and fulfillment of the U.S. Senate committee's information request.
