You and your staff will gain the skills and knowledge to reduce the risk and transmission of infection while carrying out routine work activities.

This free course is available online at your local TAFE college and participating private registered training organisation, providing flexibility for staff to train at a time that suits them.

Employees who complete this nationally recognised training may also be eligible to receive credit in a range of accredited vocational qualifications where infection control skills are required.
