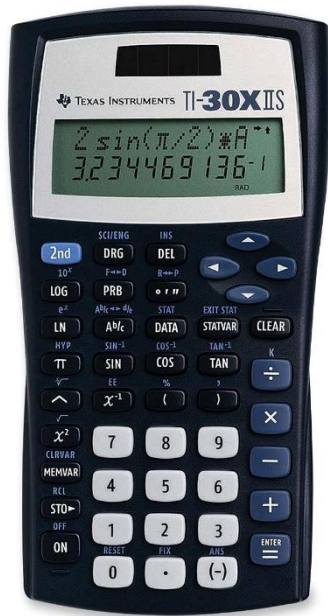


Image of TI- 30X IIS Scientific Calculator

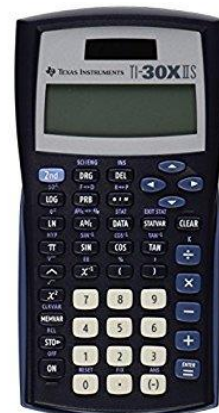
