



OUR COMMUNITY FUNDING AND INVESTMENT FRAMEWORK


Enterted into three separate MoU with Te Atiawa Iwi, Taranaki lwi and Ngāti Mutunga lwi.

THE PROJECTS

Taranaki Mounga Project

Taranaki Mounga is an ambitious conservation project transforming the mountain, ranges and islands of Taranaki. Taranaki iwi Chairs and community, supported by local and regional government, have collaborated to embrace and sustain the transformation of Taranaki Mounga to an ecologically resilient state.

• Affordable Housing Project

Assisting Taranaki whānau into full home ownership. For many whānau, making the step of buying a new home presents significant challenges. Rising house prices, mortgage house deposit requirements and ongoing interest servicing obligations make it very difficult. This partnership will remove barriers, provide on going support and will enable more whānau to own a home.

Focus on how to effectively fund Māori aspirations. There is growing momentum for philanthropy to reimage the way we invest moving away from transactional and traditional top down approaches toward inclusive, power sharing models that build stronger connections and relationships with Iwi and Māori essentially innovating a traditional funding system.

THE JOURNEY

- Funders to be less transactional
