Sub-Varsity Column –

Two Things Every Sub-Varsity Coach Needs to Do

1. Go Above and Beyond- One way to make your program successful is to go above and beyond your duties as a sub-varsity coach. Some things you can do to help the varsity coach may include helping with matchups, organizing game stats, and making sure game film is ready. An example of helping at the lower level would be to attend a practice and assist the coach put in a new offense or defense. By going the extra step you may be able to learn from an experienced coach or be able to teach an upcoming coach. Doing these little things will help create a successful program because everyone is learning from one another. Most of us have ambitions to one day be a varsity coach, going above and beyond will help you reach your goal. **2.** Be Loyal- The success of any sports program ultimately lies on the shoulders of the varsity coach. However, every head coach wants to know that they have the support from all the coaches in their program. Sub-varsity coaches need to realize that the varsity coach determines the overall direction of the program. In order for the program to be successful there needs to be an open line of communication amongst the staff. The goal of the sub varsity coaches should be to prepare their players for a seamless transition from one level to the next. The approach at the younger levels (skills, strategies, and organization) should conform with and follow the head varsity coach's philosophy.

For us it has always been and will always be about helping student athletes, those that play on boy's teams, girl's teams, private school teams, public school teams, and religious based school teams - to help them improve as a player and person. No exclusions.

Re: NCAA June DI Recruiting Events related to New York State

Note: You may know that in addition to being the Executive Director of BCANY that I also serve as the Director of Operations for the National High School Basketball Coaches Association. Additionally, I am the high school representative to and serve on the National Association Board of Directors. Holding these three positions provides me with a unique observation point as well as the chance to participate and advocate for our coaches.

Are You Confused about the new June Scholastic Recruiting Opportunities? So are we.

The NCAA has established two weekends at the end of June for Scholastic Recruiting Events. The NCAA tasked the National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) to establish the criteria for operating these events.

A. One of the criteria that the NFHS established reads that only schools that are members of the National Federation may organize and host these events. The NFHS criteria further restricts that **only players who attend a NFHS member school may participate**.

In New York State, this restrictive criteria **prohibits participation** of high school players from **any** high school in New York City. This represents **over 30%** of the schools/players in the state being **excluded**. Not allowing players from the Catholic, Private and Public Schools in New York City to participate is just wrong. This leaves out students from over 300 high schools in New York City.

At that time, the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) and BCANY agreed to not hold an event in New York because the criteria excluded schools in the NYSAISA, the CHSAA and PSAL. BOTH the NYSPHSAA and BCANY support having these type of events for girls as well as for boys.

B. After months of our advocacy, in February, the NCAA established an alternative path for approval of June Scholastic Events. We felt confident there could be events in New York State that would involve players from all schools.

However, when we asked for clarification, the NCAA said that the NFHS would not all allow participants in events approved by the NFHS to play with or against players in events that were approved through the alternative path. The players **could not "co-mingle**." his is an unacceptable situation and lacks common sense.

The Public School Athletic League and Independent Schools in NYC have declined to host events this year, but do look forward to hopefully operating events next year. The NYC Catholic High School Athletic Association will be operating an event for their teams June 28-30, 2019.

If we go back to the beginning, one of the goals of the Rice Commission was to address issues of corruption and help support student-athletes as they make decisions about their future. Limiting what student athletes can and cannot participated based on what school they attend does nothing to accomplish that goal.

Throughout New York State public and private school basketball teams often play regular season games against each other. New York has a Tournament of Champions at the end of the season where the champions of the four athletic organizations play each other. Yet, they cannot play in the same summer event. We fail to see the logic and benefit of this policy.

Other large basketball states that are not participating are Texas, Massachusetts, Virginia, Wisconsin and Florida. Some states are having events for Prep Schools and Private Schools (non-Federation) approved by the NCAA.

There are some very good events planned in some individual states and groups of states where their State Basketball Coaches Associations and State Governing bodies are working collaboratively.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

In New York State there are **four** state athletic associations. They are the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA), the Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA), the NYS Association of Independent Schools Athletic Association.(NYSAISS) and the New York City Public School Athletic League (PSAL). In most states there is only one State High School Athletic Governing Body, so they do not face the obstacles that exist in New York

To Be Clear...

The National High School Basketball Coaches Association (NHSBCA) had no role in designing the criteria nor the approval process for hosting a June Division I Scholastic Recruiting Event. That was solely done by the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS). The NHSBCA volunteered its expertise and experience but was not called upon related to criteria and approval.

In those states where the State Athletic Association worked cooperatively with the NHSBCA, we gladly accept responsibility for the design and operation of what takes place on the court during a June Event.

The NHSBCA is doing everything it can given the constraints they have to work within.

Al Monaco retires after 40 years as basketball coach

After 40 years of basketball, Al Monaco has coached his last game. Monaco announced his retirement as Villa Maria's women's coach in a news release from the school."I always wondered when I would know if the time was right, but I'm comfortable and happy to say I do know that time is now," he said in the release.

"I'm looking forward to spending more time with my family, including my wife Mary, who has been overwhelmingly supportive over my coaching career."

Monaco earned accolades at Williamsville South, where he had a 364-211 record in 24 seasons as the boys basketball coach and led the Billies to consecutive Section VI titles in 2010 and '11. Williamsville South and coach Monaco parted ways in 2012.

Monaco moved on to the collegiate level as an assistant coach with the Fredonia State's men's team, then coached by fellow Canisius College graduate Philip Seymore, but his coaching renaissance began in March 2015.

That was when he accepted a job at Villa Maria to coach women's basketball as the college was reintroducing intercollegiate athletics in the 2015-16 academic year.

Under Monaco, the Vikings enjoyed an 83-22 record and had consecutive seasons of 23 wins or more. Villa Maria won a program-record 25 games this season and lost to Central Maine, 85-78, in the United States Collegiate Athletic Association championship game.

"I really want to thank (Athletic Director) Don Silveri for giving me this opportunity. Four years ago when he gave me the chance to coach on the college level, it truly felt like he believed in me. The whole Villa family has been great throughout my time and it's been a pleasure to work with everyone here. I also want to thank all the young women who have come into the program.

"I learned as much from them as I hope they learned from me and proud to say we had unbelievable success. I know with Coach Silveri's leadership the athletic program and the women's basketball program is in great shape and I look forward to seeing how they continue to progress in the future."

Coach Jeff Anastasia retired at the end of the season as the basketball coach at Olean HS.
