

It was such a privilege to be able to return with a team to Sri Lanka and join in with the work that goes on in the church communities over there. Having been two years ago, it was great to see how much has developed in this time. The work that we did was very varied. Whilst in Colombo we worked in the school delivering assemblies and

workshops. For the students, a chance to take part in creative workshops such as drama, art, music, dance and prayer was a real change from what they are used to.
