

Brazilian Customs Authority requiring tax identification (CPF / CNPJ/Passport) on international orders and shipments

From January 1, 2020, Brazilian Custom Authority requires that all international orders and consignments have an identification of the recipient's CPF / CNPJ / Passport Number for their customs clearance initiated. Failure to provide this information may allow importations to be banned and returned abroad or destroyed in cases where return is not possible.

This information must be provided at the time of online purchase and forwarded along with the order. If it is not informed at purchase nor by the sender on the shipment, then Brazilian Post has developed a tool for customers to inform the tax id on the website via "Track and Trace" or "My Imports". Customers will need to register/login at Correios Id setting login and password, inform the order number and save the CPF (individual), CNPJ (legal entity) or Passport Number (foreign).

After registration/login at Correios Id, accessing "My Imports" and inserting the order number, then link tax id to the item. After tax id information is saved, item can start customs inspection.
