A few weeks ago, there were several articles in the news similar to the one from the Washington Post, with the headlines, "United Methodist Church is expected to split over gay marriage, fracturing the nation's third-largest denomination."

The headlines from the Washington Post and local and national stories were the results of a news release from a mediation group composed of clergy and laity who met under the leadership of Kenneth Feinberg, the mediation expert who handled the compensation fund for victims of the 9/11 terrorist attacks, among other significant negotiations.

The mediation team goal was proposing a way for churches, clergy, and conferences to leave the United Methodist Church and form other denominations in a way that is fair for all involved.

The General Conference, which meets May 5-15 in Minneapolis, Minnesota, is the only body that can make decisions regarding the future of the church. Once that body meets, it may be a while until outcomes are solid and transparent regarding the future of the United Methodist Church, as other groups may bring petitions to be considered by the delegates.

I, along with the leadership of Faith United Methodist Church, will keep you informed. Please don't be swept away by the messages from the group inside or outside the church that is predicting precisely what will happen or what should happen. Let's continue to keep our emotions in check, and rely entirely on God who will guide in the future as He has in the past.

If at any point you would like to talk with me about these concerns or anything, call. I always love to sit down with you, as together we seek to be faithful to the calling of God upon our lives.

Sunday school is a very important part of a








