Whitt's Wisdom

There are no words to fully express my joy in being your Pastor at Faith Twinsburg United Methodist Church. Dr. Eugenia Johnson-Whitt, Mrs. Eula Frazier and myself have felt a warm welcome, and immediately experienced Twinsburg as a new home Church. In sharing with many of you during the first few weeks, one theme has been constant: there is a strong desire to expand the ministries of this church in reaching out to others with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. In thinking and praying about moving from where we are today, to where we desire to be, the phrase, "to do better shorter", comes to mind. We can be better without always expelling more energy. Before we can move forward we must be open to accept ideas from all of us as God reveals his plan among the saints in this location. One way to remain open is to engage in Possibility thinking, which I have shared with you during my first four sermons, is how we mange or respond to new ideas. In other words, we are open to fresh ideas, and will not be closed-minded rejecting all we can. Instead we will pray, search, prepare, plan, execute, and evaluate, repeating that cycle more than once.

But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible" Matthew 19:26

Here are the seven concepts:

- 1. Never reject a possibility because you see something wrong with it! There is something wrong with every good idea.
- 2. Don't throw away a suggestion when you see a problem. Instead, isolate the negative from the possibility. Neutralize the negative. Exploit the possibility, and sublimate the negative.
- 3. Never reject a possibility because you will not get the credit! God can do tremendous things through the person who does not care who gets the credit. Do not worry about getting the credit. If you do, you will become ego-involved in the decision-making moments of life.
- 4. Never reject an idea because it is impossible! Almost every great idea is impossible when it is first born. The greatest ideas today are yet impossible! Possibility thinkers take great ideas and turn the impossibilities into possibilities.
- 5. Never reject a possibility because your mind is already made up! I am sure you have heard the saying: 'Don't confuse me with the facts; my mind is already made up!' I have had to change my mind publicly more than once. People who never change their minds are either perfect or stubborn. I'm not perfect and neither are you. I'd rather change plans while still in port, than to set sail and sink at sea.
- 6. Never reject an idea because you do not have the money, workers, muscle, or months to achieve it! All it takes to accomplish the impossible is mind power, workers, money power, muscle power, and month power. If you do not have them, you can get them. Spend enough time, use enough energy, develop enough human resources, acquire enough financial capital, and you can do almost anything
- 7. Never reject an idea because it will create conflict! The longer I have studied the possibility thinking, the more I have come to one conclusion. You can never develop a possibility without creating problems. You can never establish a goal without generating a new set of tensions.

Let's add one more for good luck:

8. Never reject an idea because it might fail! Every idea worth anything has failure potential within it. There is risk in everything. Risk is there in crossing a busy traffic road. Risk is there in having junk food. Risk is there in driving a car. Risk is omnipresent, omniscient and omnipotent. Decide yourself whether you want to live a risk-driven life or rest-driven life.




Faith Church is Collecting Water Bottle Caps
