Gilded Innovation: Building Materials and Technology at the Eustis Estate
1424 Canton Avenue, Milton, Mass.

A day-long workshop on the innovative building materials and technologies used at the 1878 Eustis Estate, an early work of noted architect William Ralph Emerson. Building materials and technology scholars lecture on the mansion's terracotta and molded brick interior ornament, polychrome masonry exterior, surviving coal gas generation plant; early wind power system, and unique multipurpose window assemblies. Presentations take place in the Eustis mansion with on-site access to the systems discussed.
