### 2. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

<b>Hazard Classifications:</b>	<b>6.1E, 6.4A, 6.9B, 9.1B, 9.1C, 9.1D</b>
<b>Required identification Details:</b>	6.1E: <b>Warning</b> – May be harmful if swallowed, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. 6.4A: <b>Harmful</b> - May cause eye irritation. 6.9B: <b>Harmful</b> – May cause organ damage from repeated oral exposure at high doses. 9.1B: <b>Ecotoxic</b> – Toxic to aquatic organisms with long lasting effects. Avoid contamination of any water supply with product or empty container.

### 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

**Description of necessary first aid measures:** In case of poisoning by any exposure route contact the National Poisons and Hazardous Chemicals Information Centre, PO Box 913, Dunedin. **Phone 0800 764 766, (0800 POISON).**

**General information:** Remove the affected person from the source of exposure. Remove all contaminated clothing and wash affected area. If you feel unwell seek medical attention.

<b>Inhalation:</b>	If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.
<b>Ingestion:</b>	Rinse mouth. Do NOT induce vomiting unless directed to do so by medical personnel. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Get medical attention if symptoms appear.
<b>Skin contact:</b>	In case of skin contact, immediately flush skin with plenty of water and soap. Remove contaminated clothing. Cold water may be used. Wash clothing before reuse. Get medical attention if irritation persists.
<b>Eye contact:</b>	Check for and remove any contact lenses. Immediately flush eyes with running water for at least 15 minutes, keeping eyelids open. Cold water may be used. Get medical attention.
<b>Advice to Physician:</b>	No specific antidote is known. Treat symptomatically.

## 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

<b>HAZCHEM Code:</b>	2X
<b>Extinguishing media :</b>	Dry chemical, carbon dioxide, foam, water mist. Do not use high power water jet.
<b>Thermal decomposition products:</b>	Include oxides of carbon.
<b>Protection of fire-fighters:</b>	Wear full protective clothing and self contained breathing apparatus. Do not breathe smoke or gases. All run-off must be contained.

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

<b>Personal precautions:</b>	Release or Spill: Wear chemical safety glasses with side shields or chemical goggles, rubber gloves, rubber boots, long-sleeved shirt, long pants, head covering, and an approved pesticide respirator or air-supplied respirator.
<b>Environmental precautions:</b>	Do NOT allow spilled product or wash solution to enter sewers, drains, dams, creeks or any other waterways.
<b>Methods for cleaning up:</b>	Clear area of unnecessary personnel. Extinguish any sources of ignition. Spills may be slippery and should be cleaned up immediately. Large spill: Dike and pump as much as possible to a salvage container. Absorb the remaining liquid and any small spills with clay granules, sand or other absorbent material and sweep to a waste container. Cover the spill area with water and absorb. Minimise runoff into waterways or drains.requirements of Local Authorities

## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

**Handling:** When mixing or applying, avoid inhalation of vapors or spray mist and contact with skin and eyes. Wear protective clothing, gloves and goggles. Do not eat or drink while using. Wash hands and face before meals and after work. Wash protective clothing after work.

**Storage:** Store in original container tightly closed and in a locked, dry, cool, well ventilated area, away from feed, seeds and foodstuffs. Keep out of reach of children. Store in accordance with the New Zealand Standard for the Management of Agrichemicals (NZS8409).

**Packaging materials:** HDPE Plastic bottle.

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## 8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS/PERSONAL PROTECTION

### **Engineering measures**

**Exposure control measures:** Ensure ventilation is adequate, generally natural ventilation is adequate.

### **Personal Protective Equipment**

#### **Detail specifications for equipment:**

**Respiratory system:**

Where insufficient ventilation, use suitable respiratory protection.

**Skin and body:**

When opening the container, preparing spray and using prepared spray wear cotton overalls buttoned to the neck and wrist and a washable hat, elbow-length PVC gloves and goggles.

**Hands:**

Elbow-length and PVC gloves

**Eyes:**

Wear chemical goggles or face shield.

**General hygiene:**

Avoid inhaling aerosols and vapours. Avoid contact with eyes and skin. Store work clothes and street clothes separately. Wash hand before breaks and at the end of work. Change contaminated protective clothing. Keep away from food, drinks and tobacco.
