PROFILE

Laurent Martray's vineyards are located on Chateau de la Chaize— he is one of the vigneron for the estate, and also creates wine under his own name from the same vines. The site boasts a chateau built between 1674 and 1676 by François de la Chaize d'Aix, the brother of Father La Chaize, the official confessor of Louis XIV. The estate is located in Odenas, 45 kilometres northwest of Lyon. This is a famous area, on a huge estate in the south of Burgundy, with 99 hectares of vineyards.

The vineyards for Laurent's wines "Vieilles Vignes" and "Corentin" cuvées are located on the Combiaty hillside, facing east and the south-east. The soil consists of granitic rocks, sand and silt on the surface.

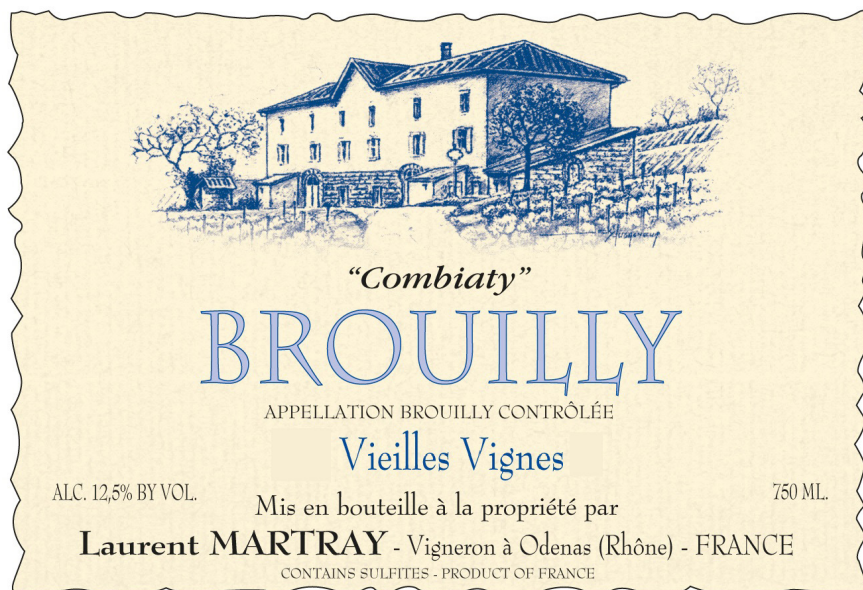
Agricultural Method: Traditional

Vinification: Partial destemming, temperature-controlled fermentation. 8-10 day vatting period with semi-carbonic maceration. Aged in oak barrels. Bottled with no fining and very light filtration.

Alcohol: 12.5%

Residual Sugar: > 2g/l

Acidity: 3.5 g/l
