1. Apologies

2. Adoption of previous AGM minutes (2017)

The Secretary offered to have the previous minutes read out but due to the length of the document and its early circulation, it was unanimously agreed to accept the previous minutes. They were proposed by Matt Coon and Seconded by Dave Churchill.

3. Chairman's Report

The Chairman reflected on another season at Varwell Field;

Another year has passed, and I am again amazed at the rapidity in which it has done so. In reality the cricket itself only lasts for five months, and I suppose it is just a sign of my advancing years, but it still seems too short a time since I was sitting in this same seat reflecting on the season before.

Once again, we maintained a strong membership of the club, with both colts and seniors up on numbers and with all our sides, from AllStars to the 1st XI, continually representing the club with the respect and high standards that we have come to expect.

It is always a pleasure to welcome new members to the club and for me, there have been notable newbies over the last couple of seasons. Dan Coles's representation on the clubs committee has gone from strength to strength who has aided the club, almost as Lloyd's assistant secretary! Once more, Debbie Simpson and Emma Williams have been wonderful additions to the Bar and Social committee by assisting with teas and colts and together, alongside Alison Churchill and Karen Crouch make the social events run so smoothly. There has been assistance in almost every area and our clubs great work ethic was shown in its true glory on the final day of the season. It was an absolute pleasure to see 35+ players, past and present, all coming down to the club to finish the season with a Twenty20 fixture and to spend time with your teammates to ensure the end of season maintenance jobs were completed. This I hope, is something that we can repeat for years to come.

My extended thanks also go to our outgoing President, Graham Pascoe. Everyone knows how affiliated the Pascoe name is with the club and we are extremely grateful for both Graham and Jean's efforts over the years. My extended thanks also go to our Treasurer and Secretary, George and Lloyd, for their continued support and their efforts are reflected in the annual accounts and reports that are to follow. The wider GMC has a huge role to play on how the club can continue to progress and our meetings are always full of healthy debate – my thanks to everyone who plays their part.

Our colts continue to grow each year and most notably our under 13 side, whom many of them are already starting to be integrated into our senior Saturday or Development sides. One exciting note about that side is that many of the age group also become eligible to play open-age cricket for the 2019 side, meaning our senior captains will have even more players to pick from! I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the many age group managers, parents, players, officials and administrators who help make the colts what it is today. Myself and Lloyd's ambition is to continue the fantastic legacy that Marcus West and his team have built over the years and this can only be done with a 'all hands on deck' approach – and volunteers are always required.

The senior cricket was a bit of a mixed bag, but that is not to say that there was not plenty of smiles and laughter throughout the season – ultimately it is for this very reason why we are all affiliated with the club. I thought Ash Berry came of age this season, leading from the front with bat, gloves and with the captain's armband. He was able to rally our troops and in the end we finished a comfortable 6th place. Having spoken to Ash, I know that him and Lloyd are already talking to potential players to bolster both senior sides for 2019 and beyond. Our 2nd XI continues to improve year on year, and with the influx of colts to follow, alongside the senior figure heads, I know we will only grow stronger. Both sides retained their divisional status, something that was in line with our 5-year plan.

I remain again to be proud of the history of our fantastic little club, the people in it and our contribution to local cricket and wider community, and I am pleased to have thoroughly enjoyed the 2018 season with you all. I look forward to 2019 with unerring optimism and wish you all the best for a short winter and an exciting season ahead.

4. Treasurers Report

The Treasurer presented the annual accounts as attached at Appendix 1. The accounts were not gone through point by point however the main elements identified were:

- The general health of the accounts. We currently have more than £10,000 in the combined accounts compared with approximately £7000 last year. Healthiest since Treasurer been involved.
- Main incomings similar to most years:
 - a. Sponsorships: (circa £4700)
 - b. Grants: (c£3000)
 - c. Memberships (c£2300)
 - d. Bar (c£4700)

A significant addition this year has been the summer draw which was very successful: c£900.

- Outgoing similar to previous year:
 - a. Bar (c£2800)
 - b. Insurance (c£1300)
 - c. Plant (c£3900). NB: most of this a replacement mower following the burglary
 - d. Ground maintenance (c£1900)
 - e. Dinner (c£2100): NB: both this and last year's dinner included in the costs here.

The Treasurer also explained that there is less in the youth account than this time last because there is an element of youth membership monies still be transferred across from the general account. There is also an old youth account which is waiting to be closed with an unknown sum (minimal) held in it.

Going forward the plan will be to build up the reserve account to invest in new projects. The Club also notes that the hire agreement with the College has come to an end which will mean a gap in the accounts next year however the Club wishes to continue building the good relationship with the College going forward.

Asked if there were any questions and there were none forthcoming.

The Chairman and Secretary, thanked the Treasurer for his great work, and this was echoed by the membership.

5. Secretary's Report

The secretary reflected on his first year in the role;

Firstly, I am delighted to open what is my first secretaries report to announce that our ClubMark re-accreditation has been successful. Stacks of work go into this and I would like to take this opportunity to thank those who have been involved and assisted in the process. I am truly grateful.

I could very much echo much of Jerry's report but I have just a few items that I would like to touch on. Firstly, Chris Yeo is standing down from the committee after several years – hopefully just temporarily due to a busy year coming up at home and work. During this time Chris had a stint as club secretary, designed and maintained our new website, skipped the twos, maintained our club stats and taken our sponsorship to a new level, bringing in about £9,000 over the past 3 years and helping George bring in over £10,000 from Ashburton Town Council, Teignbridge District Council and Devon County Council. With Chris & Amy's wider circle about to be increased by +1, Chris has requested that he step down from the membership of your clubs committee. Chris has however, very kindly, offered to continue his work as our Sponsorship guru but standing aside from the GMC means he can pass monies over to the Treasurer without having to get involved in the day to day running of the club. For this, the club is extremely grateful. *(The membership was unanimously in agreement)*

Talking of legends, I would like to continue my thanks with Alan Churchill and Jerry Crouch, who have worked so immensely hard on the ground this season. With the addition of the Dartanians, and additional games for the colts and friendly sides, we have had more fixtures than ever for the ground to be maintained. The ground was always a picture and no doubt maintaining the ground in the summer sun with a beer in hand was a tough ask!

Whilst on the subject of Jerry, I think we can all safely say that he goes well above and beyond his role and job spec as Club Chairman. As I mentioned at the awards night, the efforts that both Jerry and Karen go to are not to be underestimated and for that, we should all be extremely grateful. Jerry leads the GMC superbly and my final thank-you goes to those within in our incredibly hard-working management committee. I know they are all just on the end of the phone, for any assistance or advice that is required. We meet monthly and I am sure meetings may be slightly shorter now, with the absence of Chris Yeo!!

Ashburton is a special place to watch, play or get involved with cricket, and the future is certainly bright – however this is always more we can do and if you feel there is a way that you can assist to help improve the facilitates that we offer to the community, your actions are always welcome!

7. Adoption of Membership Subscriptions for 2019

The Treasurer explained the addition to the subscriptions regarding those players playing 4 or less games to fall in line with the proposed constitution and ensure good house keeping. These proposals were agreed by the GMC and put forward to the AGM due to the state of our healthy accounts.

8. Adoption of Constitution Amendments

Amendments were agreed and the new constitution can now be found in this document as Appendix Two. The Chairman offered the membership a vote on the constitution however the vote was unanimous with no objections.

9. AOB

The Secretary made the membership aware that the GMC had written to the DCL to try and enforce a rule change to any league that offers neutral umpires. This would be debated at

the AGM (should it not be thrown out prior to that within the divisional meetings) and voted on the member clubs of the DCL. Rule as follows;

Any clubs in a division in which the Devon Association of Cricket Officials (DACO) provide independent umpires, should have full working mobile covers (not a sheet). In addition to this working sightscreens should be both ends.

The league could consider a two-year grace period for clubs who do not meet the above requirement. No Club shall be promoted to a higher division unless its facilities comply with the Facilities Criteria for that division.

The Chairman thanked the membership for their turnout and closed the meeting at 2019.

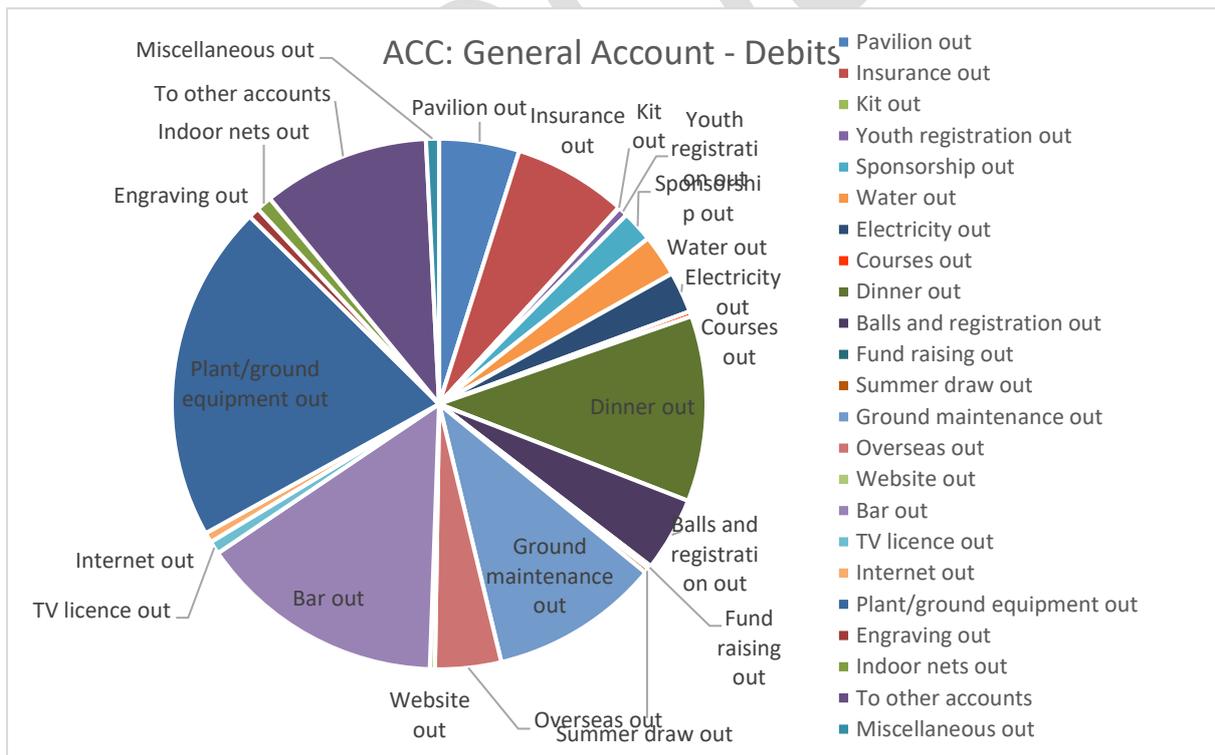
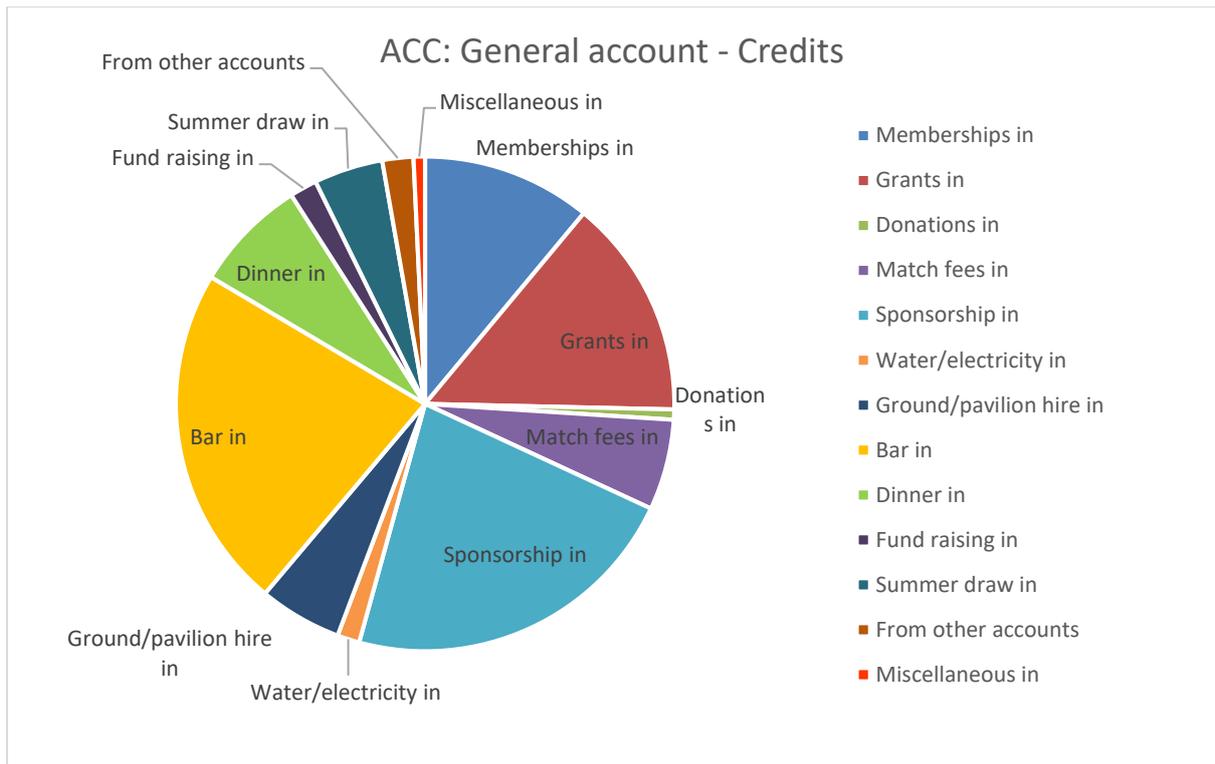

Appendix Two – Accepted Constitution

CONSTITUTION AND RULES

1. The Club Name, Colours and Affiliation

The Club shall be called the Ashburton Cricket Club.

Its colours shall be green and gold.

The Club shall be affiliated to the Devon Cricket Board, and the ECB.

Aims and Objectives

- To foster and promote the sport of cricket at all levels within the community and within the sport, providing opportunities for recreation, coaching and competition.
- To manage the Ashburton Cricket Club.
- To ensure that all members, playing and non-playing, abide by the ECB Code of Conduct which incorporates the Spirit of Cricket and by the Laws of Cricket.
- To ensure a duty of care to all members of the club by adopting and implementing the ECB 'Safe Hands – Cricket's Policy for Safeguarding Children' and any future versions of the Policy.
- To ensure a duty of care to all members of the club, volunteers, employees and spectators by adopting and implementing the ECB Cricket Equity Policy and any future versions of the Policy.
- To encourage all members to participate fully in the activities of the club.

2. Officers

The Officers of the Club shall comprise:

- (a) President
- (b) Chairperson
- (c) Honorary Secretary
- (d) Honorary Treasurer
- (e) Honorary Fixtures Secretary
- (f) First Team Captain
- (g) Second XI Captain
- (h) Sunday Captain
- (i) Midweek Captain
- (j) Colts Manager.
- (k) Welfare Officer.

(a) Ashburton Cricket Club is fully committed to the principles of equality of opportunity and aims to ensure that no individual receives less favourable treatment on the grounds of age, gender, disability, race, ethnic origin, nationality, colour, parental or marital status, pregnancy, religious belief, class or social background, sexual preference or political belief. This includes participants, volunteers, employees and spectators at the Club. Membership is open to all. The General Committee is responsible for ensuring that this Equity Policy is followed and to deal with any actual or potential breaches.

(b) Application for membership of the club shall be by completion of a membership application form and by payment of the relevant subscription/joining fees as determined by the Annual General Meeting of the club.

- (c) No person shall be eligible for selection for any club team unless the appropriate subscription has been paid by the specified date or membership has been agreed by the Committee.

The appropriate subscription is:

- The full subscription for the season in question; or
- If the date is between April 1st and May 31st, one subscription instalment equal to one quarter of the full subscription paid by 1 June of that season; or
- If the date is between June 1st and June 30th, a second subscription instalment equal to one quarter of the full subscription paid by 1 July of that season; or
- If the date is after the 1 July, a third subscription instalment equal to one quarter of the full subscription paid by 31 July of that season' or

The 'fixture subscription' if having opted to pay on a game by game basis, applicable for playing a maximum of four games of any type per season at which point the full subscription is a required for the season.

- (d) The club Committee may refuse membership, or remove it, only for good cause such as conduct or character likely to bring the club or cricket into disrepute. Appeal against refusal or removal may be made to the Committee who shall appoint an Appeals Committee to hear the appeal.

3. Management

The management of the Club shall be vested in the General Committee. This shall consist of the Officers and up to four elected members.

4. Election of Officers etc.

The Officers, Committee Members and Auditors shall be elected individually to serve a term of one year by majority vote at the Annual General Meeting.

5. Membership

Membership of the Club shall comprise:

- (a) President
- (b) Vice Presidents
- (c) Honorary Life Members
- (d) Full Playing Members
- (e) Student Membership (Full-time education/Training)
- (f) Colts (an u18 player at the start of the season)
- (g) Non-Playing Members

Honorary Life Members shall be nominated by the General Committee for election at the Annual General Meeting.

A list of members in each category shall be maintained by the Treasurer or other Officer of the club.

6. Subscriptions

Subscription fees shall be reviewed annually by the General Committee and adjustments put before the AGM for its approval. Fees shall be paid by 31 May. Any persons whose fee is not received by that date in any season will not be eligible for selection. New members joining after that date shall pay half the full membership.

Vice Presidents will be expected to pay a minimum fee of £10.00 per annum.

For subscription purposes the Club year shall run from 1 May to 30 April.

Match (or training) fees will be decided by the General Committee, or as notified by the host Club on away matches.

7. Finance

- a) The Club financial year shall run from 1 October to 30 September.
- b) The property and funds of the club cannot be used for the direct or indirect private benefit of members other than as reasonably allowed by the rules and all surplus income or profits shall be reinvested in the club.

8. Team Selection

Selection of teams shall be vested by the appropriate committee of Captains.

9. General Meetings and Players' Meetings

The Annual General Meeting shall be held in October each year. Reports by the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer, and the audited accounts, shall be submitted at the AGM.

A special General Meeting may be convened at any time by the General Committee or upon a written request for such a meeting submitted to the Honorary Secretary and signed by not less than six paid-up members. A minimum of fourteen days notice of all General Meetings shall be given to all Club members.

A meeting of all Playing Members may be convened by the General Committee at any time provided a minimum of seven days notice is given to all players.

All General Meetings will be chaired by the Club Chairman with the exception of the AGM during the election of Officers. On that occasion the President will take the Chair. Meetings of Playing Members will be chaired by the Club Captain.

All members as defined in '5. Membership' above have full voting rights at General Meetings and have eligibility to serve as committee members/officers of the club.

A quorum at any General Meeting shall be ten paid-up members. Each paid-up member at any General Meeting shall have one vote. There shall be no proxy votes.

10. General Committee

The Committee shall meet whenever deemed necessary. At least seven days notice shall be given by the Honorary Secretary to all Committee Members of the date of the Committee meetings.

A quorum shall be a majority of the members of the Committee. Each member shall have one vote only. The Committee shall be responsible for the efficient management of the Club and shall control Club finances. The Committee shall have the power to elect new members and reprimand, suspend or expel any member who is deemed to be guilty of misconduct detrimental to the interests of the Club. Suspension or expulsion shall be enforced only after the Member has been given seven days notice of the proposed action, and has been allowed to appear before an Appeals Committee if he so requires.

An elected Committee member ceases to be such if he or she ceases to be a member of the club, resigns by written notice, or is removed by the Committee for good cause after the member concerned has been given the chance of putting their case to the Committee. Appeal against removal may be made to an Appeals Committee. The Committee shall fairly decide time limits and formalities for these steps.

The Committee shall have the power to appoint sub-committees when necessary and delegate to such sub-committees any powers they require. Where a sub-committee is authorised by the General Committee, its assets both financial and chattels are owned by ASHBURTON CRICKET CLUB. These fully auditable assets must be submitted to the General Committee annually by the 31st August each year. These accounts must be of sufficient quality to be assimilated into the main accounts for audit. The Chairman of each sub-committee shall be a member of the General Committee and will report regularly to it. The General Committee shall have the power to fill any vacancies in Officers or Committee Members as they occur, and to co-opt members to serve on both the General Committee and sub-committees.

The General Committee shall have the power to make such bye-laws as are considered necessary for the good administration and order of the Club provided that no such bye-laws shall conflict with any of the Club Rules. For this purpose this document shall form the basis of all Club Rules. A copy of all bye-laws will be displayed in the pavilion.

Discipline and Appeals

All complaints regarding the behavior of members should be lodged in writing with the Secretary.

The Committee shall appoint a Disciplinary sub-committee who will meet to hear complaints within 14 days of a complaint being lodged. Any member requested to attend a Disciplinary sub-committee shall be entitled to be accompanied by a friend or other representative and to call witnesses. The Committee (or its sub-committee) has the power to take appropriate disciplinary action, including the termination of membership.

The outcome of the disciplinary hearing shall be put in writing to the person who lodged the complaint and the member against whom the complaint was made within 7 days following the hearing.

There shall be a right of appeal to the Committee against either the finding or the sanction

imposed or both following disciplinary action being taken. The Committee shall appoint an Appeals Committee (a maximum of three) which shall not include members involved with the initial disciplinary hearing but may include non members of the club. The Appeals Committee shall consider the appeal within 14 days of the Secretary receiving the appeal. The individual submitting the appeal shall be entitled to be accompanied by a friend or other representative and to call witnesses. The decision of the Appeals Committee shall be final and binding on all parties.

11. Trophies

Trophy winners will be selected annually by a sub-committee consisting of the Club Chairman, First XI Captain, Second XI Captain and Sunday/Midweek Captain.

The Les Luckson Trophy will be awarded at the sole discretion of the Chairperson.

The 'most improved player' award will be decided by the sub-committee.

For the First XI, Second XI and Sunday/Midweek XI awards:

- The Captains Cup shall be awarded at the sole discretion of the appropriate Captain.
- The Players Player shall be awarded based on the votes of all eligible players for each team (eligibility being having played at least 1 game for that team during the season), with votes sent in private to the captain.

For the First XI and Second XI:

- The batting award shall be won by the player with the most runs, providing they have played a minimum of 6 games.
- The bowling award shall be won by the player with the most wickets, providing they have played a minimum of 6 games.
- The all-rounder award shall be won by the player that is highest on the respective lists of run-scorers, wicket-takers and wicket keeping & fielding dismissals with the sub-committee making the final decision in the event of a tie (e.g. Player A is 2nd in the runs and 3rd in wickets, and Player B is 3rd in runs and 2nd in wickets). Winner must have played a minimum of 6 games.

For Sunday XI/Midweek XI:

- The batting, bowling and all-rounder awards will be decided by the sub-committee and be an overall judgement based on statistics, contributions and improvements.

12. Club Rules

Membership of the Club signifies acceptance of this Constitution and the Rules contained herein. A copy of the Constitution and Rules shall be displayed on the notice board in the pavilion. No alteration shall be made to the Constitution or the Rules except by a resolution passed at a General Meeting by a majority of two-thirds of the fully paid-up members present. Notice of any alteration or addition must reach the Honorary Secretary by 30th September if the resolution is to be discussed at the next AGM.

13. Dissolution

- a) If at any General Meeting of the club, a resolution be passed calling for the dissolution of the club, the Secretary shall immediately convene a Special General Meeting of the club to be held not less than one month thereafter to discuss and vote on the resolution.
- b) If at that Special Meeting, the resolution is carried by at least two-thirds of the Full Voting Membership present at the meeting, the Committee shall thereupon, or at such date as shall have been specified in the resolution, proceed to realise the assets of the club and discharge all debts and liabilities of the club.
- c) The Committee will then be responsible for the orderly winding up of the club's affairs.
- d) After settling all liabilities of the club, the Committee shall dispose of the net assets remaining to one or more of the following:
 - e) to another club with similar sports purposes which is a registered charity and/or
 - f) to another club with similar sports purposes which is a registered Community Amateur Sports Club and/or
 - g) to the club's governing body for use by them for related community sports

14. Declaration

Ashburton CC hereby adopts and accepts this Constitution as a current operating guide regulating the actions of all members.

RULES ADOPTED TO COVER LICENSED BAR

The permitted hours for the supply of liquor shall be such as may from time to time be fixed by the Committee in accordance with the provisions of the Licensing Act 1964 and as notified to the Magistrates Clerk and Police. Provided that if an order is made under Section 60 Sub-Sections (3) or (4) of the said Act, Section 62(2) shall apply.

No person under 18 years of age shall be sold, or supplied, with intoxicating liquor, or be permitted to consume same on the Club premises.

Members shall be entitled to introduce guests to the club. The names of all guests, together with their addresses, and the name of the introducing Member, shall be entered in the Guests Book. Not more than 3 guests may be introduced by a Member in any one day, and the same guest shall not introduce more than 12 times in any calendar year. Guests may purchase intoxicating liquor.

Persons other than Members and their guests may be admitted to the Club premises, being persons visiting the Club by invitation from the Committee, for official purposes within the objects of the Club, including Members and Officials of representative teams playing cricket at the ground. Intoxicating liquor may be sold by, or on behalf of, the Club for consumption on the premises by persons admitted in accordance with this rule.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS

The candidate's name and address shall be posted on the Notice Board in the Club premises for a period of seven days, whereupon the election of such candidate for membership shall be determined by the General Committee. In no event may a candidate become a Member of the Club unless elected by the majority of the Committee.

ADD TO RULE 10 ON 'COMMITTEES'

The purchase for the Club, and the supply by the Club, of intoxicating liquor, shall be in the absolute discretion of a Sub-Committee of not less than five Members of the Club, appointed by the Committee for that purpose. In the event of any Member, for any reason, ceasing to be a member of the Club, he or she shall automatically cease to be a Member of the Sub-Committee, and another Member shall be appointed in his or her place.

THESE RULES WERE ADOPTED AS AN EXTENSION OF THE CLUB'S CONSTITUTION AND RULES ON 10th FEBRUARY 1984
