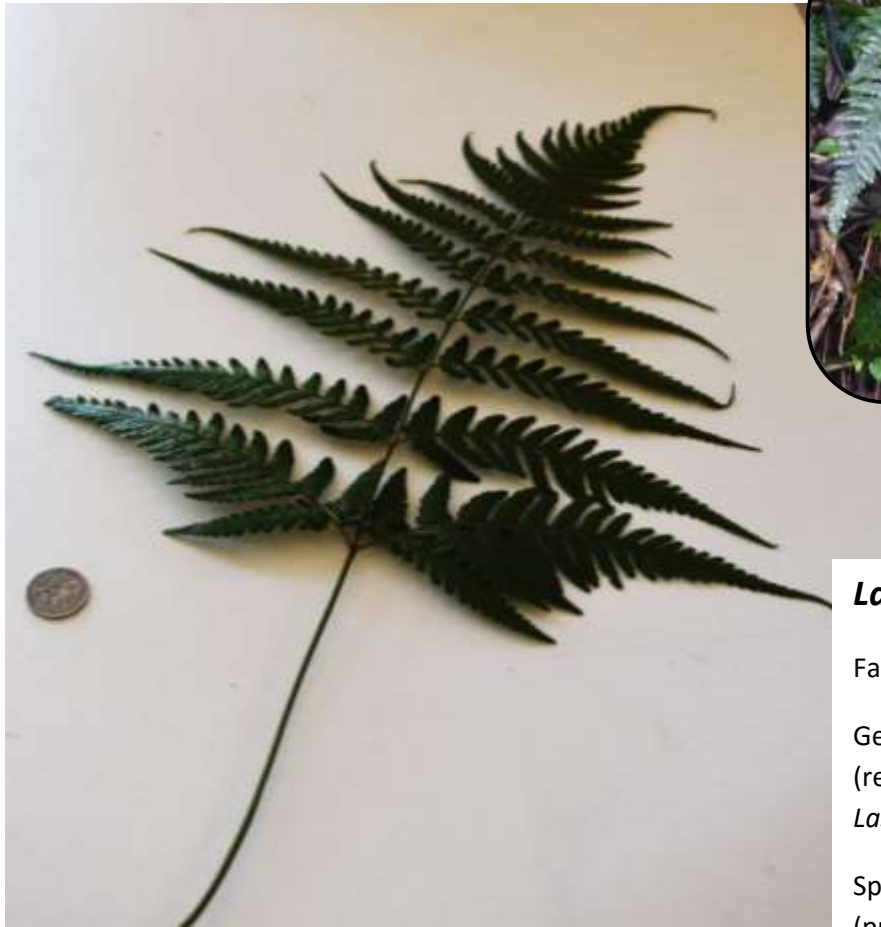


Lastreopsis munita



Lastreopsis munita: Naked Shield Fern

Family: *Dryopteridaceae*

Genus: *Lastreopsis* from the Greek *opsis* (resembling) and the superseded fern genus *Lastrea*.

Species: *munita* from the Latin *munitus* (provided with, fortified or protected by), in reference to the sharply toothed pinnae margins.

This dark green and glossy terrestrial fern grows in height to 20-80cm and spreads slowly.

It is found in rainforests and wet sclerophyll forests near creeks.
