Hay's Catechism	Bp. George Hay	1781	The Sincere Christian Instructed in the Faith of Christ from the Written Word. First of three catechetical volumes from the redoubtable Scot Bp. Hay. Keenan's Catechism	Fr. Stephen Keenan	1846	A Doctrinal Catechism. Written to refute heresy, Q&A format. Rejected false notion of infallibility, improved the doctrine's positive exposition in editions after Vatican I.	LINK	*
Deharbe's Catechism	Fr. Joseph Deharbe	1848	A Complete Catechism of the Catholic Religion, or Fander's Catechism. A master catechist, Fr. The Baltimore Catechism	Bishops of the United States of America	1885	A Catechism of Christian Doctrine, Prepared and Enjoined by Order of the Third Council of Baltimore. The most widely used catechism in the USA for over a century. Multi-volume Q&A format with varying answer length per volume: Concise edition for students (No. 1), Main edition (No. 2), Expanded edition (No. 3), Annotated edition for teachers (No. 4). The Penny Catechism	Bishops of England & Wales	1905	A Catechism of Christian Doctrine. Approved and endorsed by bishops of England and Wales, with numerous English reprints since. Catechism of Pope St. Pius X	Pope St. Pius X	1908	Compendium of Christian Doctrine. Written by a Pope and great Saint, intended for the laity by a champion of orthodoxy. Patterned on Trent and Bellarmine. Q&A format.	<u>LINK</u>	***

Fundamentals of Catholic Dogma	Fr. Ludwig Ott	1952	Fundamentals of Catholic Dogma. One of the greatest summaries of Catholic dogma ever composed, systematically unpacking Church teaching with exhaustive references to Scripture, Fathers, Councils, and Popes. Expositive format.
