# TE PUIA

Te Puia is an iconic cultural tourism attraction in Rotorua in the heart of New Zealand's North Island.

Visitors to Te Puia get up close and personal with gushing waters, steaming vents, bubbling mud pools and spectacular geysers, including the world-famous Pohutu Geyser. Te Puia also houses a nocturnal kiwi house. Māori tradition thrives at Te Puia with daily cultural performances, indigenously-inspired dining experiences and hourly guided tours through the historical Te Whakarewareware Geothermal Valley. Te Puia is also home to the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute (NZMACI) which was established in 1963 by an Act of Parliament to maintain and preserve traditional Māori art forms. At its core, Te Puia's responsibility lies in protecting and perpetuating Māori traditions, arts and crafts. At any time between 20 to 30 students study onsite with visitors being able watch the students hard at work.
