Pastor's Letter



When the morning came, all the chief priests and elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put Him to death. When they had bound Him, they led Him away and handed Him over to Pontius Pilate the governor.
Matthew 27:1-2

We are now in the season of Lent. Ash Wednesday was the first day of Lent and the season runs for 40 days (excluding Sundays). The significance of the 40-day period of Lent is based on two episodes of spiritual testing in the Bible: the 40 years of wilderness wandering by the Israelites and the temptation of Jesus after he spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness. As the calendar runs this year, the Lenten season extends through the entire month of March and ends April 1, Easter Sunday.

The Lenten season is a time when many Christians observe a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ - his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial and resurrection. Such reflection is an important part of a Christian's life, as it gives a renewed focus on the meaning of Christ's ministry on earth which ended with him laying down his life -- the supreme sacrifice - for the sins of the world.

At UMC Mount Kisco, the congregation is observing this holy season in a number of ways - - we have committed to 40 Days of Prayer and Fasting, a district initiative, that reinforces the importance of praying and sacrifice in our faith; our lenten Bible Study, learning in the Book of Acts about the leadership and sacrifice of the apostles as they spread the word of the Gospel, giving birth to the church of Christ 2000 years ago; Soup and Soul, lenten fellowship and reflection continues each Wednesday evening at 6:30 pm in Halstead Hall through March 21, as does the Bible Study, which convenes at 2 pm in Porter Library.

Also, during Holy Week, two special joint worship services will take place: Maundy Thursday (3/29) Tenebrae and Seder at Katonah UMC, and a Good Friday (3/30) worship service at 12 noon in the UMC Mount Kisco sanctuary (more information about these events are in this newsletter.)

Lent is indeed a time for personal reflection and private prayer for all of us. We need to focus on how we live our lives. Are our own habits and activities all indicative of a healthy, open and loving Christ-like way? Probably not. Our humanity needs to be "tweaked" regularly by recognizing our less-than-great behaviors. And Lent is the time when you and I are encouraged to self-examine, repent our misdoings, and ask for God's Holy Spirit to show us a better path on our journey.

Lent is not only about giving stuff up by fasting, abstaining, and doing without; it's also a great time to take on something new that a disciple of Jesus Christ would do. It's up to you: how will you invest your Lenten season meaningfully? Volunteering? Tithing more to the church? Donating to value-added charities or service organizations? Spending extra, quality time in prayer? There are many opportunities to take such steps now; the how is up to you, and God!

Lenten thoughts...



Lent is a season of being invited by God in a deeply personal way. “Come back to me, with all of your heart,” our Lord beckons. “We will,” we respond, but we aren’t quite ready yet, our hearts are not prepared. We want to squirm, evade, avoid. Our souls not yet perfect. We are not ready for God to love us.

Lent offers us all a very special opportunity to grow in our relationship with God and to deepen our commitment to a way of life, rooted in our baptism. In our busy world, Lent provides us with an opportunity to reflect upon our patterns, to pray more deeply, experience sorrow for what we’ve done and failed to do, and to be generous to those in need.

Lent is an invitation to GROW, REFLECT, PRAY, EXPERIENCE, SORROW, BE GENEROUS....what an invitation!

“Burned Biscuits”

Scripture: Matthew 5:14-16: *You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under a bushel basket, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory your father in heaven*

“When I was a kid, my Grandma liked to make breakfast food for dinner every now and then. And I remember one night when she had made breakfast after a long, hard day. On that evening so long ago, she had placed a plate of eggs, sausage and extremely burned biscuits in front of my Granddad. I remember waiting to see if anyone noticed! Yet all my Granddad did was reach for his biscuit, smile at my Grandma and ask me how my day was at school. He ate every bit of that thing – never made a face nor uttered a word about it! When I got up from the table that evening, I remember hearing my Grandma apologize to my Granddad for burning the biscuits. And I’ll never forget what he said: “Honey, I love burned biscuits every now and then.”

Later that night, I asked him if he really liked his biscuits burned. He wrapped me in his arms and said, “Your Grandma put in a hard day of work today and she’s real tired. And besides – a little burned biscuit never hurt anyone!” As I’ve grown older, I’ve thought about that many times. Life is full of imperfect things and imperfect people. What I’ve learned over the years is that learning to accept each other’s faults, and choosing to celebrate each other’s differences, is one of the most important keys to creating a healthy, growing, and lasting relationship. And that’s my prayer for you today...
