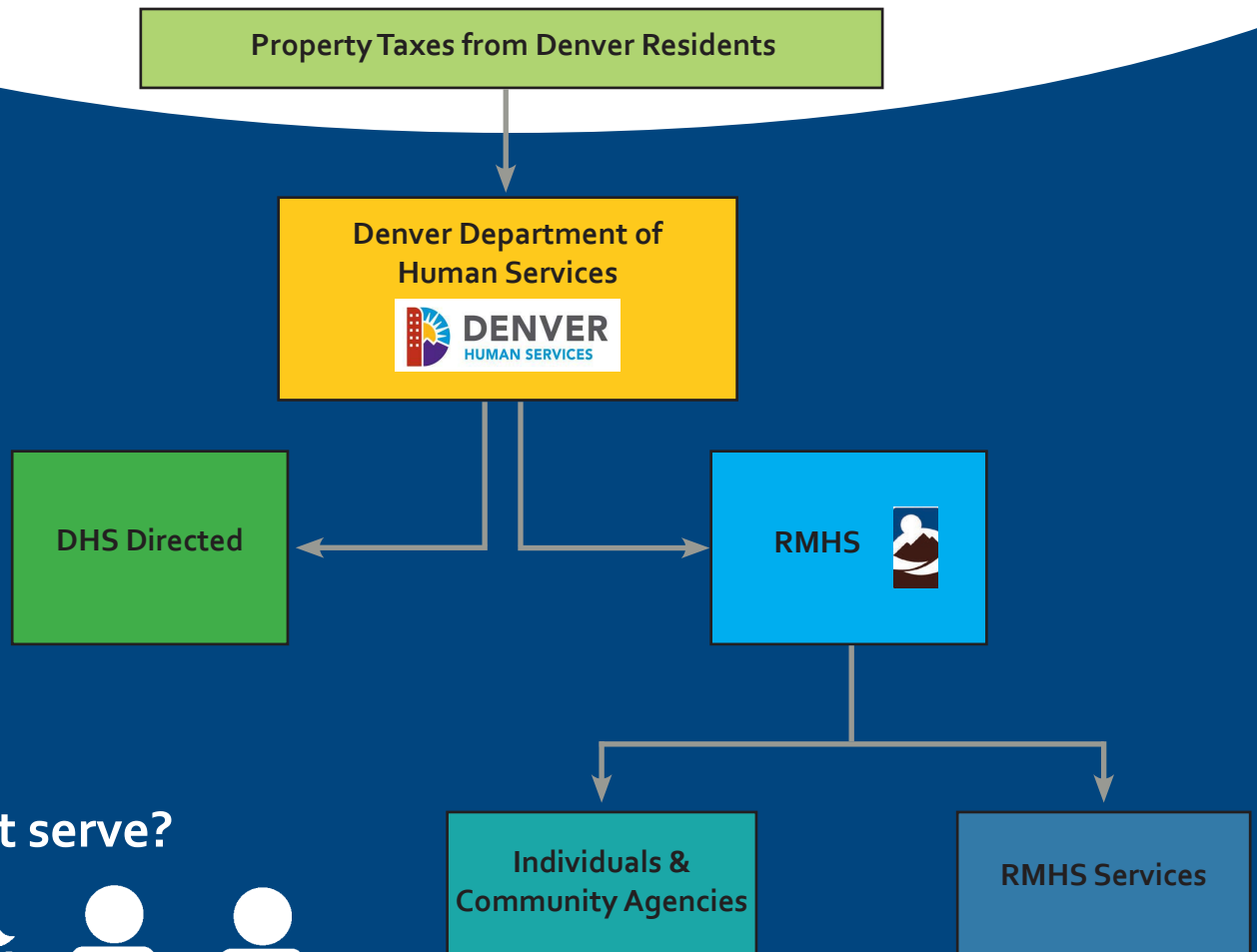


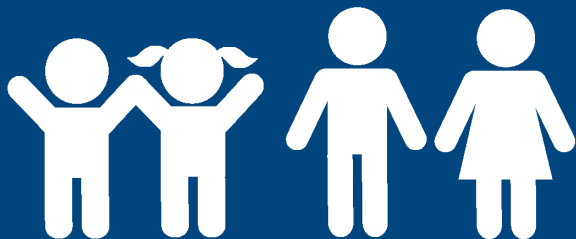
What is the Denver Mill Levy?

- In 2003, Denver residents approved a mill levy initiative to support individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities in Denver.
- In 2017, Denver City Council codified the mill levy.
- Most property tax funds that come from that mill levy are directed to RMHS to support services provided by community agencies, providers and family members, as well as RMHS.

Who does it serve?



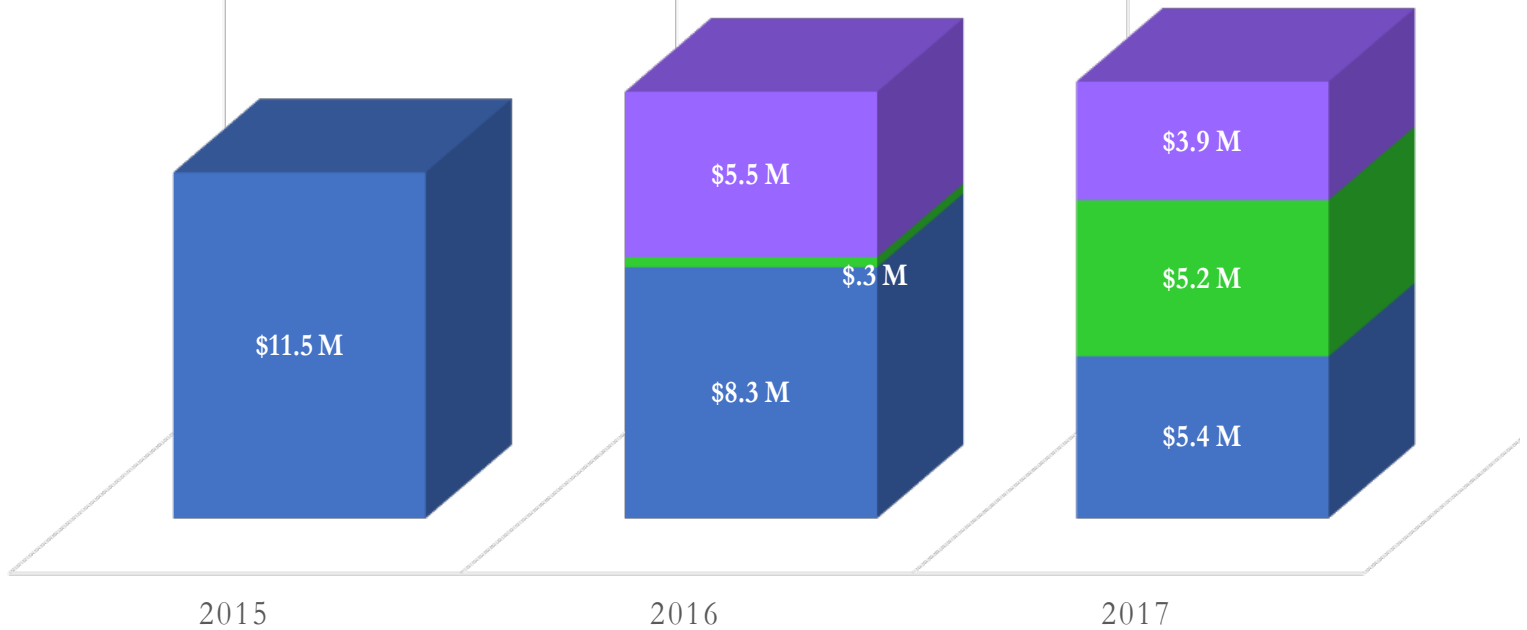

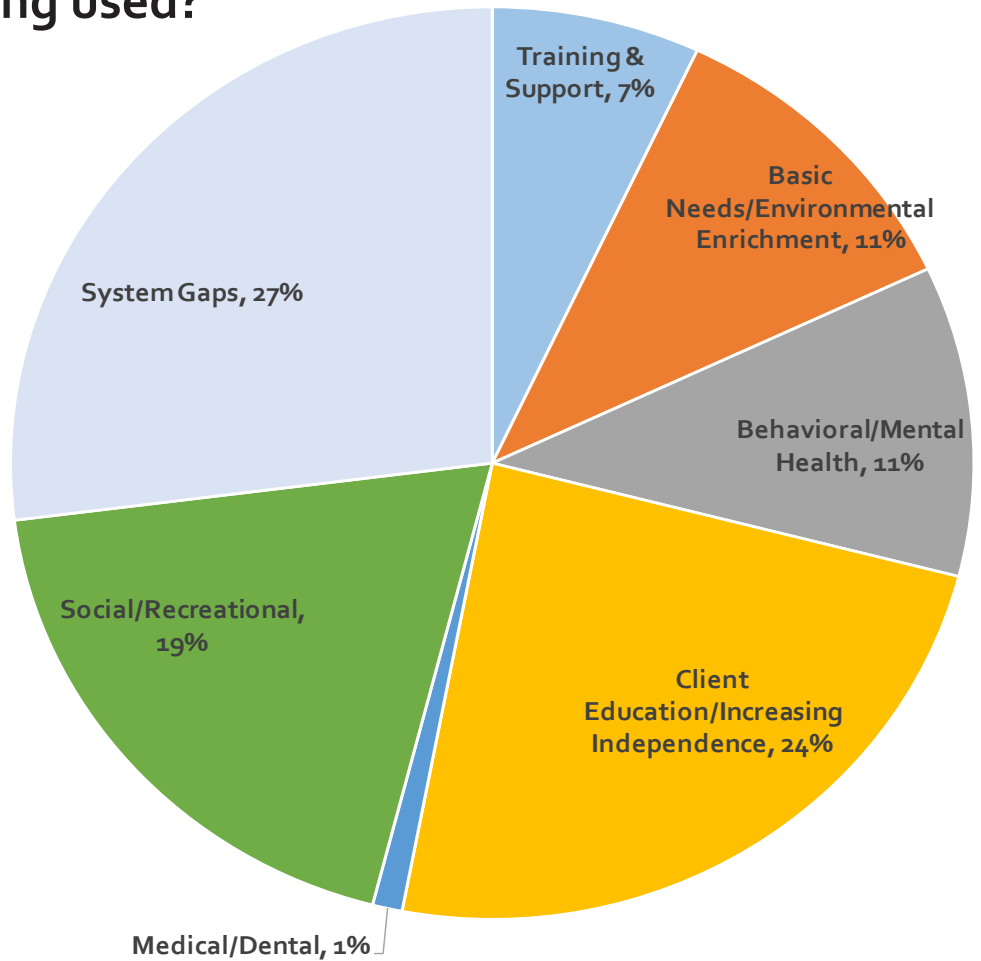
Where does mill levy funding go?
