


















SKETCHBOOK



CREATIVE FASHION DESIGN

S: GRADE 10~12 | T: GRADE 7~9

JULY 2 - 13 (2 WEEK)

MONDAY TO FRIDAY 1:30 - 4:30 PM

This course focuses on helping students understand the steps for undertaking fashion design process. While immersing students in the world of fashion, the instructor will introduce the principles of fashion design and its relevant knowledge and skills. The students will be guided to develop their ideas from extensive research to experimentation on materials, shapes, and forms of garments.

FASHION DRAPING

S: GRADE 10~12 | T: GRADE 7~9

JULY 16 - 27 (2 WEEK) MONDAY TO FRIDAY 1:30 - 4:30 PM

In this course, the instructor will cover the basic steps to draping and making paper patterns. Students will learn how to transfer a draped project to paper, and add the proper seam allowances for accurate sewing. The instructor will also cover how to drape and draft a women's shirt, skirt, and sleeve block with different variations. Many essential draping components such as pleats and dresses will be introduced. At the end of the course, the students will have a complete draped dress that is cut out and pinned to show their new skills.

Monaco is a professional costume designer. She has worked on several short films, TV series, and feature films such as "Star Trek 3", "Arrow", and many more. She has also worked on various projects in theater and fashion. CREATIVE OIL PAINTING WORKSHOP

S: GRADE 10~12 | T: GRADE 7~9

JULY 16 - 20 (1 WEEK)

MONDAY TO FRIDAY 1:30 - 4:30 PM

This course focuses on equipping students with the basic oil painting knowledge, techniques, color theory and more. Through this one week course, students will complete an oil painting that is rich in uniqueness and creativity.

FIGURE DRAWING WORKSHOP

S: GRADE 10~12 | T: GRADE 7~9

JULY 16 - 20 (1 WEEK)

MONDAY TO FRIDAY 4:30 - 7:30 PM

This course emphasizes on teaching students the basic human anatomy, body structure, and figure drawing techniques. The students will perform a variety of sketching exercises and learn how to capture human proportions, gestures, tone, and more.

ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN

S: GRADE 10~12 | T: GRADE 7~9

JULY 2 - 13 (2 WEEK) AUGUST 20 - 31 (2 WEEK)

MONDAY TO FRIDAY 1:30 - 4:30 PM

Students will be given a topic on "Sustainability". Relating this word with their experience and observation, students will choose a site to propose a design that will reflect their vision of a green city. Designs are ranged from landscape scale to architectural scale or can even be a small technological industrial design. Throughout this comprehensive and intensive class, students will gain experience implementing the design process by doing research, analysis, 3D modeling, and physical modeling. This course focuses on developing students' logics and design thinking.

INDUSTRIAL DESIGN

S: GRADE 10~12 | T: GRADE 7~9

JULY 30 - AUG 10 (2 WEEK) MONDAY TO FRIDAY 1:30 - 4:30 PM

The aim of this course is to expose students to use laser-cutting as a prototyping method. Within the two week course, students will learn how to make use of laser-cutting as a method and plywood / paper as the core material to design and create a lantern or a piece of accessory.
