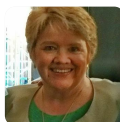

FROM THE DESK OF GOVERNOR CHARLES WILSON

Dear Montana Kiwanians:

For the first time in our history, we did not hold a Midwinter Conference. We decided to cancel it due to adverse weather and travel conditions. Our Kiwanis Risk Manager John Menyhart from Miles City was to have given a presentation there, but after we decided not to hold the meeting, he emailed me that he supported that decision – that part of managing risk is to avoid hazardous situations in the first place. So our cancellation of the Midwinter Conference turned out to be an object lesson in managing risk! Who knew?

I just returned from the Montana Key Club District Convention (they abbreviate as DCON) in Billings. It was held March 24 to 26 at the Billings Hotel and Convention Center. About 170 attended, including a lot of clubs that hadn't attended in a few years, also including my home club of Glasgow. Kiwanians attending included Governor Elect Jim Greene, and past Governors Bob Keene, Dave Curry, Alida Wright and Chuck Rushing. Mardy, Nadine, Jessica and others we know also attended. As usual it was filled with enthusiasm and high energy and excitement. I emphasized the Kiwanis connection and encouraged them to continue participating in Kiwanis family service after graduation from High school. They elected new officers from a slate of very qualified candidates. The PRESIDENT of Key Club, Emily Rice of Minneapolis also attended and she was amazing. We also hosted Braeden Dorchester, Key Club International Trustee from New York. For their service project they put together about 5000 meat and cheese sandwiches for Billings Salvation Army. Lots of service awards were also given, and the Montana Kiwanis Foundation Scholarships to graduating Key Club students were announced, \$1000 yearly, renewable for up to three more years. You should be very proud of the success of Montana's Key Clubs and all of their service hours. Be sure and thank the Key Clubs that your Clubs sponsor for their service, and involve them in joint activities and projects.

With the cancellation of the Midwinter meeting, we are expanding the Annual meeting that will be held in Glasgow August 1-4 at the Cottonwood Inn. We are planning an informal no-host Thursday night event with the famous Eugene's Pizza at Sam and Jeff's (the former location of Sam's Supper Club), Friday luncheon opening ceremony, Friday night at the Fort Peck Interpretive Center, Fish Fry, and Fort Peck Theatre playing Peter Pan, Saturday noon banquet, and then leaving Saturday night free if you choose to buy tickets to attend the Sawyer Brown concert at the Northeast Montana Fair being held that same weekend. Art Riley, Kiwanis International Vice President will be attending. You can come Wednesday if you want to enjoy our Northeast Montana Fair activities, and eat at the Boy Scout food booth sponsored by the Glasgow Kiwanis Club. More details will be forthcoming, but make plans now to come early and have a good time.

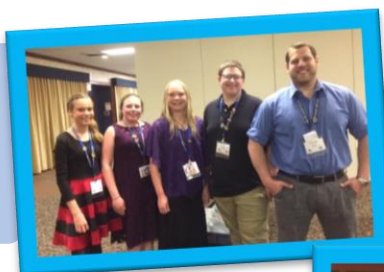
DISTRICT CONVENTION REPORT

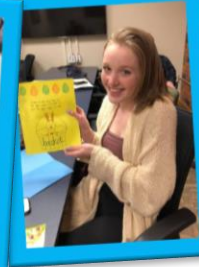
