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Should I be lucky enough to be elected, there are a few main issues that I would like to address during my time as College Representative:

- Address students' concerns with the College's Placement Program: For many
 years, students have continuously had to deal with the problem of having to take
 their first offer they receive for placement. Not only this, but students have been
 assigned interviews having never had a formal interview before. I would like to work
 with the College, and also with UCC Careers Services to see if there is a way to
 address and solve these problems.
- Find an alternative time for the BIS 3rd Year Exams: So many students who find themselves sitting their third year exams in BIS before commencing their placement, have to sit exams during Raise and Give week. Unfortunately, these students are not afforded the same study conditions as students sitting exams at the regular exam periods, such as 24hr Library Space. I want to liaise with the Cork University Business School to see if an alternative time can be found.
- Panopto needs to be available to all students: We are lucky that in the College of Business and Law, we have so many students engaged with extra curricular activities, such as sport, societies and other volunteering opportunities. We are also instructed by the College to build on our CV, and up-skill outside of our hours in university. In order to facilitate this, we need to make Panopto available to all students in order to encourage participation in extra curricular activities.
- UP-SKILL! Source extra funding to allow students to participate in
 entrepreneurial activities, university business competitions etc.: I believe that
 every student should be afforded the chance to use their creativity and knowledge,
 to both benefit themselves and the University. Students should be offered the
 chance to turn their Final Year Project where applicable into a feasible business
 opportunity. Similarly, students who are interested in participating in international
 university competitions such as case-competitions should be supported.
- Introduce a mentorship program for all students within the College: I would like to introduce a new systems for all students, to support their studies during their degree (this exists in some but not all programs in the College). This would include both an academic and personal mentor to assist you with any queries during your studies.
