"Get up! Pick up your mat and walk." Obviously, the man now had a choice. He could listen and ignore, listen and hope or he could listen and obey. This opportunity was totally unexpected. It is almost shocking, yet the man must make a choice. He chose to seize the moment. Don't we all have that choice? Jesus invites the man to participate in this miracle. In His words "to take up his bed" the Lord is telling him and all those who truly want to change, something very important: do not make any provision to go back. Many people fail right here. Many will not step out on faith and burn their (crutches) bridges behind them. However, we have several advantages over the man in this account. Remember, he had been in his condition 38 years; he didn't know who Jesus was or what he could do; nor did he have anyone to assist him in his efforts. However, we have the good news of the Gospel available to us. We know who Jesus is and what He came to do. He is willing to help and heal us. We are free to call on Him today in prayer.
