It wasn't until they saw the angelic messenger that they realized the reality of a past experience had been eclipsed by a new reality. The angel stood before the women and proclaimed: "He is not here! He is risen!" A new reality has taken place. Jesus is resurrected. The prophecy of His death and resurrection was true. His true Divinity has been proven!

Easter Egg-Citement ~ One is Empty

It is a custom in our Byzantine Rite to have a priest bless baskets of special foods that are to be shared on Easter Sunday as we celebrate the Lord's Resurrection with our families. Some of you were present on Holy Saturday afternoon to prepare your very own Easter basket which typically contains eggs. Today, imagine another Easter basket — but this one contains only four eggs. They are very special because inside of each egg there is something that will teach us exactly what Easter means.

Inside the first egg is a cross. The cross reminds us that Jesus willingly carried His cross to Calvary to die for our sins. No one told Him He had to do it; He did it because He knew that was the only way that we would ever get to heaven. God loved us so much that He sent His only begotten Son so that we could have everlasting life.

Inside the second egg are three nails. They remind us that Jesus was nailed to the cross. The nails that were used to nail Jesus to the cross weren't little nails, but great big ones. Can you imagine the pain He must have felt? He suffered great pain as the nails were driven into His hands and feet. He suffered the pain to pay the price for our sins.

Inside the third egg is a stone. The Bible tells us that after Jesus died, they placed His body in a tomb and put a huge stone over the entrance. On Sunday morning, three women went to see the tomb and the stone had been rolled away and the tomb was open. The stone reminds us that even a huge stone could not keep Jesus in the grave.

That brings us to the fourth egg. The fourth egg is empty. The Bible tells us that when the women went inside the tomb, it was empty. Jesus was not there. At first the women thought that someone had stolen the body of Jesus. But inside the tomb was an angel who told them, "He is not here. He is risen, just as He said He would. Come, see the place where He lay." The empty egg reminds us that Jesus' tomb is empty. "Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!"

The Jesus we serve willingly was nailed to the cross, but He could not be kept in the tomb by a stone. He is risen and lives in heaven with God, His Father. The Bible tells us that everyone who believes in Him will join Him in heaven with the Father.
