# Jesus Heals A Man Born Blind

n the last Sunday of the Easter Season, the story from the Holy Gospel of St. John tells about Jesus healing a man who have been blind since he was born. Listen in...

Jesus was walking along in Jerusalem when He saw a man who was blind from birth. His disciples ask Him who had sinned to Cause this; him or his parents. The rabbis (spiritual leaders of the temple) of the day had thought up a principle that someone had to have sinned in order for this to have happened. They even thought that a child could sin while growing in its mother or that its soul could have sinned there as well. Jesus contradicted these "principles". Jesus said that neither the papy growing in its mother or the parents had sinned to Cause this. He said, "This happened so that the work of God might be displayed in the life of the child."



So, Jesus spat on the ground, made mud with His saliva and put it on the man's eyes and told him to go wash it off. Immediately, the man's eyes were opened and He went home seeing!

Wow! What do you think was the first thing the man saw? Remember...he was born blind. He has never seen before. He had to just imagine what everything looked like. He had never seen colour. His neighbours didn't recognize him! These people had seen this man his whole life, and they don't recognize him?

Do you think this still happens today? Do you think that God has things happen to us so that His work can be displayed in our lives? Absolutely!

Let us pray: Dear Jesus, the difficulties in our life seem small when compared to what others may be facing. Help us not to grumble and complain, but to praise and glorify you in every situation. Amen.

Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound, that saved and strengthened me. I once was lost, but now am found, was blind but now I see.
