
The Mission Collection for March is designated for Community Clothing Assistance. Its goal is to assist in the relief of poverty among needy families and people in crisis with an emphasis on community supported clothing assistance programmes.

On the Fourth Sunday of Great Lent, we hear about the healing, at the request of his father, of the boy who is possessed by a demon. The father comes to Christ and describes his plight, a pitiable one. This boy is cast into the fire and into the water by this demon. He was incapable of free thought. He was incapable of free action because this demon controlled him. It took him where it wanted, it made him fall down where it wanted, it threw him towards the water or towards the fire, and the boy's father could only with great difficulty save him from being burned or being drowned.

It's not too much different, really, for us. We unfortunately addict ourselves to sins -- fire and water. Our plight is also a terrible one. We are addicted, we must admit this. We must admit that we need help. We must see ourselves for who we truly are and then we can come to Christ for healing.

The man in today's Gospel said, "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief." When you say, "Lord, I believe, help my unbelief," He will hear it and He will strengthen your belief. Amen!

Our venerable and God-bearing Father John Climacus (ca. 579 - 649), also known as John of the Ladder, John Scholasticus, and John Sinaites, was a 7th-century Christian monk at St. Catherine's monastery at the base of Mount Sinai. In Greek, his epithet is $K\lambda i\mu \alpha \kappa o \zeta$ (Klimakos). The Eastern Church celebrates his feast day on March 30.

He came to the monastery and became a novice when he was about 16 years old, and when he died in 649 he was the monastery's abbot. He wrote a number of instructive books, the most famous of which is The Ladder of Divine Ascent. (It is because of this book that John is known as "Climacus," which means "of the

ladder".) It describes how to raise one's soul to God, as if on a ladder. This book is one of the most widely read among Eastern Catholic and Orthodox Christians, especially during the season of Great Lent which immediately precedes Pascha (Easter), and on the fourth Sunday of Great Lent he is especially commemorated.

Most people 'give up' something for Lent like eating chocolate or sweets, cutting down on the number of hours you might watch TV, or not spending a lot of money on movies or other fun activities. Other people might 'go on' something like reading the Bible more, helping an elderly person or attending more services at Church.

We are now past the half-way point of Lent and soon our journey to Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection will be over. There is still time to prepare ourselves for these holy events 5. and if you haven't done anything yet during Lent, it's not too late to do so. Here is a list of activities that you can try.
