On the 3rd Sunday after Pentecost, we hear Jesus telling us not to worry. Despite this, we still worry — a lot. And God knows we worry. And God's cure for worry is to trust Him. Trust in His love. Trust in His goodness. Trust in His provision. Trust that He cares for you, that He is for you and not against you. We can maybe start there and then move to bigger and better ways to trust God. We can trust that Jesus endured the suffering of the cross because He loves us; that He died on that cross to bring us close to God. He gave His life as a sacrifice to take away our sins, so we can have nothing in the way of a beautiful relationship with God now, and then

an eternity with God to look forward to in the future. How do you start to trust if you don't already? Learn to divert. Divert all that mental energy that goes into worrying, into instead trusting in His love. Turn that worry, that as we've seen is really a waste of time and energy, turn that worry into prayer. And then, and only then...this is the hard part... you can learn to actually leave the problem with God. Leave it with Him, leave it at the foot of the cross.

On the 4th Sunday after Pentecost, we hear the centurion tell Jesus to "just say the word..." That's authority. The centurion knew God's place. He didn't ask Jesus to pray for his servant to get better – he asks Him to command the healing. Just say the word and my servant will be healed. That is authority. He knew what it was like to command and to be commanded. (Remember: he was in charge of 100 men.) He knew that when orders were given that people obey. This a very important principle in Scripture. The Bible teaches us that authority is given. Jesus said all authority has been given to Him on heaven and on earth. And it is His now to give to us. We cannot earn it, buy it or borrow it. It must be given to us by God himself. Authority goes all the way up — all the way up to God (Romans 13:1). There is no authority except that which God has established. All authority comes from Him.
