he decision to follow Jesus is the decision to take up a cross - a tool of torture and execution. To Christians, it is also a symbol of

victory over the Enemy, including death. "My Cross to Bear" is not just the daily troubles. Taking up our cross is an expression that requires us to bear the things that humble us, expose us, offend us, shame us - that come because we are following Jesus. He experienced all of this and more as He carried the cross... to His death. Furthermore, the decision to follow Jesus is to deny our right to ourselves, take up the cross, accept the circumstances that result from making that choice, looking to Him for power to endure and grow.

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

n Matthew's Gospel, Jesus says to the woman, "Great is your faith! Let it be done as you wish." When we come to Jesus in humility and need, He wants to forgive and heal us. He's not looking for our curriculum vitae or our list of accomplishments or genealogy. He's much more able to help us if we admit that we are sinners, and weak, and in need.

Yes, we are in the midst of a new unpleasantness, something the world hasn't seen for a century. But we are muddling through and will, by the grace of God, recover, sooner or later. Let's learn the lessons that might actually help us in the long run to attain the goal, coming together forever in God's presence. To this end, let us continue to follow Isaiah's command to keep the Sabbath – the one day of the week that God wants from us, and for us.
