he Gospel from the 9th Sunday of Pentecost (Jesus walking on the water) is not only a lesson about faith, but also about motivation. In our daily lot in life, we are often confronted with circumstances and sudden unexpected appearances. Do we withdraw? Cower? Face it head on? Do we respond with a word with Jesus? In times of peril – real or imagined – Jesus should be our number one contact. Ask Him in prayer to protect us with His Holy

Spirit and guide our response. When we realize that Jesus is right there with us, we can muster up faith and have great comfort and even some element of bravery.

How will we ever know the extent of our own faith; how will we perceive the will of God in a sink or swim situation? Our faith will surface when we call out to Him and He will save us – even from ourselves sometimes. Peter began to sink when he took his eyes off Jesus and looked at the sea wanting to swallow him up. There's the lesson: let's keep our eyes on Jesus in those times of peril, NOT on the crisis (sea) that wants to swallow us up.

In the 10th Sunday, Jesus paints a picture of the type of faith that His disciples needed in the situation at hand. They asked, "Why couldn't we cast out the demon?" The disciples had cast out demons before. Why was this one different? Well, the demon was not the issue; rather, it was their lack of faith. Like a mustard seed, faith has to grow in order to access the things of the Kingdom. A little faith is not enough; it has to continue to grow and become so dominant that is overshadows and blots out any unbelief in life. And when that happens, Jesus smiles, "nothing will be impossible to you."

Y TEETH SCREAMED. I couldn't neglect them any longer. I finally ignored my fear of dentists and decided to get them fixed. But how? I was a college sophomore and barely supported myself with part time jobs. Maybe I could fix the worst one. I flipped open the Yellow Pages and called the first dentist within walking distance. The receptionist told me to come right over. As I hurried across the campus, I forgot the pain in worrying about how I would pay the bill.

I stared at him. He really meant it. He calmly picked up his tools and fixed the aching cavity.


From that day on, I saw him every week until my teeth were in good shape. And he kept them that way with regular checkups. After graduation, I got a job and settled his bill in a few months.
