n forgiving the paralytic man's sins, Jesus is not suggesting that a specific sin has directly led to the man's paralysis. Jesus is merely cutting through the surface to the humanity's heart problem that then shows itself in the brokenness of the world where some are paralyzed, and sickness, disease and natural disasters are all signs that things are broken and groaning, waiting for rescue and release. Jesus could have just healed the man and left him with his 'heart problem'. Jesus could have gone around fixing the surface issues of the world, providing bread, healing diseases, stopping storms, but not addressing the issue behind those surface manifestations. By forgiving the man's sins, Jesus highlights the greater need of you and me, and His ultimate destination – the cross, to deal with our sinful hearts. A reminder to our mistaken priorities that it is better to enter the kingdom and await a future physical wholeness, than to receive physical healing now and fail to enter the kingdom of God.






HOLY CROSS GOLDEN AGERS

Lent is a season of conversion: we acknowledge the ways we have turned away from God in our lives, and we focus on turning our hearts and minds back toward God. Hence the three pillars of Lent are **prayer**, **fasting**, and **almsgiving**. These observances help us turn away from whatever has distracted or derailed us and to turn back to God. Giving up something for Lent is ultimately a form of fasting. We can deprive ourselves of some small pleasure or indulgence and offer that sacrifice up to God. Or we might "give up" a bad habit, such as smoking, as a way of positively turning our life back toward what God wants for us.

Let's Do Our Part to Bring Others to Jesus

veryone knows what a blanket is and the many things it can be used for, such as a cover on a bed, something to sit on at a picnic, and even as a comfort object for small children - like Linus in the Peanuts comic strip. A blanket can also be used to Carry someone to a hospital when he or she has been injured, especially if an ambulance is unavailable. Four people are needed to each grab a corner of the blanket that the injured person is on — and off they go!



In today's Gospel story, this is almost exactly what happened when a group of men wanted to take a friend to Jesus. The Bible tells us that four men were carrying a paralyzed man (he was unable to walk) to Jesus. They knew

that if they could just get him to Jesus that Jesus could heal him, but they couldn't get to where Jesus

was because of the large crowd. The four men carried their friend up to the roof and made an opening in the roof. Then they lowered the man down through the roof to where Jesus was. When Jesus saw how much faith these four men had, He not only healed the paralyzed man, He even forgave him of all his sins. Wow!

Now, it may seem unthinkable, but all of us have friends (and perhaps family members) who need to come to Jesus. It may not be easy, but if each of us will do our part, together we can succeed. We may meet obstacles, but we must never give up. We must hold on to our corner of the blanket and Carry on until we bring them to Jesus, especially during Lent.

Dear Jesus, we all have friends who need Your healing and Your forgiveness. May we be faithful to grab a corner of the blanket and bring them to You. Amen.
