Focus on the Gospel Readings

he Gospel passage from the 6th Sunday teaches us that Jesus, Who stirred up so much controversy by His claims about Himself, proves He is the Son of God. And as the Son of God, He possesses the divine authority to forgive sins that are committed against God. He has taken the burden of our debt to God on Himself — He Who had no 'sin-debt' whatsoever; and Who willingly paid the debt for us. And what's more, Jesus has the authority from God Himself to announce our debt to God "forgiven". The prophet Isaiah says of Him that "He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows" (Isaiah 53:4); and that "the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all" (v. 6).

On the 7th Sunday, we are taught that Jesus has the authority to restore physical sight to those who are blind, and did that frequently enough to show He had that power. This is why people today can pray for healing, although they must allow that the answer to their prayers may come now, or in the resurrection, for God has His timetable and His purposes.

But behind the healing of the blind men is the deeper meaning of the healing of their souls. Jesus was more concerned with the spiritual blindness in Israel than the physical blindness, which was often a symbol of the former. And the fact that these men came by faith to be healed physically shows that Jesus had already begun to reveal Himself to their souls, that they already had been enabled to see spiritually.

The second point of the passage is that faith is required to gain sight, both physically and spiritually. Whoever comes to Christ must believe that He is the promised Messiah and that He has the power and the authority to give sight. We who have received our sight, who have come to faith, should then be characterized by (1) praise and thanksgiving, (2) devotion to Christ, (3) a growing spiritual discernment in all things, and (4) public witness of the glories of the Lord.

Faith and Works - Neither Can Stand Alone



An illustration of the balance between faith and works lies hidden within any tree, vine, or plant. Leaves use up the nutrients in the process of photosynthesis. As the leaves consume nutrients in the sap, a suction is formed, which draws more sap from the roots. Without the sap, the leaves and branches would die, but the continual flow of this sap comes only as it is used up by the work of the leaves. Likewise, we work, keep the Lord's commandments, in order to abide in His love. (John 15:4-10).

A Christian worked each day transporting tourists across a lake. On occasions, he would present the Gospel and its implications for life in an unusual way. He had painted the word "Faith" on one of the oars of his rowboat and "Works" on the other. When they got rather far from shore, he would stop, and beginning to row with only the one oar marked "Faith," he would cause the boat to go in circles to the left. Reversing the process, he would pull on the other oar marked "Works," and they would circle in the opposite direction. By this time the bewildered passengers were waiting for an explanation. This afforded him an opportunity to give the truth concerning discipleship. He always concluded by saying, "You see, neither faith nor works can stand alone. They are twins that cannot be separated!" (James 2:14-26).

AN IMPORTANT LETTER TO ALL PARISHIONERS OF HOLY CROSS PARISH

This is the time of the year that many Thunder Bay residents enjoy the most. But as families take vacations and enjoy the warm weather — not long enough for many of us in this part of the world, so do the financial woes of our area churches. Attendance is naturally lower during July and August when families tend to leave the church for some time, then, unfortunately, return to a 'financially neglected' church. You say you didn't know? Most don't, but it's true. That said, a church in many ways is much like a business. It has overhead, payroll, its own 10% tithes to the eparchy, emergency items and costs, and so on. These things must be paid in order to operate, just like any other business in the city or it runs the risk of closing its doors.

There is, however, one fundamental difference: the church doesn't take a profit. Just as fast as the money comes in, it goes out — to benefit the congregation. So, it needs your help. How? By doing one of the following things: 1) Send in your weekly envelope(s) ahead of your planned trip; 2) play appropriate catch-up when you return; or 3) tithe while away through regular mail or through our parish website. Please understand that this is <u>not</u>, nor has it ever been, because the parish is greedy and wants more, but rather, as quoted in Deuteronomy 14:23, "The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives." Remember: once your church is gone...it is gone. And unfortunately, we have already witnessed this twice in the past ten years. Please give what you can, for as St. Paul says in Acts 20, verse 35: "Remember the words that the Lord Jesus Himself said, "There is more happiness in giving than in receiving."

No matter where you go to get away, you can take your church with you. The answer is right in your hand: your smartphone or Ipad. During the summer months, you can find and follow our parish on its website (www.holycrosstbay.com) and on Facebook.com/holycrosstbay. You'll feel more connected to it and your fellow parishioners. You will also help to spread our message and mission. Whether you're at the beach, the amusement park, the airport, or just enjoying some quiet back yard time, church information, donations, offerings and tithes are just a few taps away.

Finally, have you considered including your parish in your will? A will is an expression of your commitment to the people and groups that you cherish here on earth.
