We hear today how Jesus demonstrates that He has the power to save people from their sins. In healing the paralytic man, He has removed the ravages of sin upon his life. This is the very purpose of His coming: not to judge but to heal. Jesus does warn, however, that those who reject His words, will find much worse punishment. Ironically, a lot of people want God to heal them from the consequences of their sin, but are not willing to give up the sin that has caused them the problem in the first place. God has come to heal us rather than judge us, but unless we are willing to give up the sin in our lives, the suffering will only come back worse. Just as the paralytic was not only healed, but had his full strength restored to him, so it will be for those who recognize and receive the touch of the great healer, Jesus.



"Rise, Take Up Your Bed and Walk"

ave you ever been in an impossible situation one that seemed helpless and hopeless? Our physical needs are obvious, but as we learn about the ministry of Jesus, we find ourselves in great need spiritually. We are sometimes so concerned about our bodies, how they feel and how they look, that we neglect our spiritual need for God to heal our heart from sin.

In today's Gospel, we hear of a man who needed healing and hope in his life. In many ways we are like him because we have a desperate need for healing within our heart from sin.

In Jerusalem, near the temple, there was a pool called "Bethesda" which contained five porches where sick people would lay waiting for an angel to stir up the water, for whoever stepped in first would be cured of his or her illness (this is what the people believed). A certain man who was there had been sick for 38 years (we're not really sure why), but he was unable to move into the pool fast enough after the water had been stirred up. Jesus saw the man and went to help him asking, "Do you want to be healed?" The man replied that he did not lack the desire to be healed, only the means, as he was weak and did not have anyone to help him.

Can you imagine the loneliness and despair this man experienced for 38 years? It was "every man for himself" as they competed for the waters at the moment they were stirred.

Jesus then said, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." And immediately, the man was made well, took up his mat and walked." Later on, Jesus said to the man, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, so that nothing worse will happen to you." Jesus knew the more serious problem was the crippling condition of sin in his heart. Jesus wanted to heal the man spiritually, to Cleanse him from his sins.

What a wonderful feeling of excitement and relief this man must have experienced through this miracle. What a miracle it was to be healed from a lifetime of sickness! But he needed an even greater miracle, to have his sins forgiven. His healing was great, but he had to turn from his sins and seek God's forgiveness to be spiritually healed. It is God's forgiveness that will ultimately be the greatest gift we can ever receive, for this is our greatest need. Hopefully, this man realized that Jesus brings healing and hope to a troubled world.
