# Readings for the First Sunday of Lent (Sunday of Orthodoxy)

(to help prepare for the nourishment of the Word of God at Liturgy)

**Epistle: Hebrews 11: 24-26, 32-40: 12: 1-2** (Faith in God our Father)

Gospel: John 1: 43-51 (Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael)

As you read each passage, ask yourself these questions:

"What thoughts, ideas, words or images come to mind?" and "What are the connections between them?"

This will help make them easier to follow and understand.



# Jesus Wants Us to Collect Treasures in Heaven

o you collect anything? Stamps, coins, stuffed animals, and hockey cards have been popular items for many years. Some collections are very valuable, like paintings by famous artists. Some collections, like family photographs or seashells, may not be valuable in terms of money but are special to just you because of the memories they hold.

Jesus warned His followers about collecting treasures on earth because treasures on earth can break, get stolen, wear out, or be destroyed. If someone were to break into your house, they might find your coin collection and steal it. A water leak in your house could ruin your collections of stuffed animals or trading cards. Do you understand why Jesus warned His followers not to concentrate on stuff on earth? Treasures on earth can't last forever.

Jesus encouraged His followers to store up treasures in heaven instead, where they won't break, get stolen, wear out, or be destroyed. What are some ways you can store up treasures in heaven? Here's a short list just in case you are not sure.

- Obeying God
- Helping others
- Giving money to God
- Sharing Jesus with our friends
- Spending time at Church worshipping, learning, working, and serving

Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." What Jesus was saying is that if you concentrate on collecting treasures in heaven by doing the things that were mentioned above, your heart will be in heaven also. Is "in heaven" a good place to have your heart? Of course it is!

Let us pray: Dear God, we want our hearts to be in heaven with You. Help us to concentrate on storing up treasures in heaven by obeying You, helping others, giving You money, sharing Jesus with our friends, and spending time at Church worshipping, learning, working, and serving. Amen.
