Due to COVID-19 and the restrictions placed on our parish halls, there will be <u>no</u> Hallowe'en Party for the children this year. Hope to see you all next year — safe and healthy!

On **Sunday, October 25**, St. George's Society members will commemorate the **Feast of Christ the King**, but in a slightly different manner. There will be <u>no</u> procession from the hall into the church and members will not be seated together, However, they will approach to receive Holy Communion (self-distancing) in advance of the rest of the congregation.

Daylight Saving Time <u>ends</u> on **Sunday, November 1** at **2:00 a.m.** (right after Hallowe'en). Remember to turn your clocks <u>back</u> one hour at that time or do it earlier so you don't forget — or you will be very early for Sunday Divine Liturgy, and there may not be any ushers/greeters in the narthex at that time to let you in.





Attention gentlemen: The annual Corporate Communion & Breakfast meeting on Sunday, October 25 will go ahead as planned. By now, most members have been contacted to confirm their commitment as the Ramada (Airlane) has already been booked and given the approximate number attending. The staff there ensures us that all protocols and precautions re: COVID-19 will be adhered to, and that regular inspections have taken place. This year, we will <u>not</u> have a procession into the church *en masse*, nor be seated together in the pews. Semi-formal dress (blazers, ties, etc.) is encouraged, but is optional this year. The cost remains at \$10/member, payable at the hotel.

COVID-19 Updates: 1) The Fish and Game Committee has formally cancelled the annual banquet, originally set for November 7 in the parish hall due to the current restrictions; 2) Pyrohy making is still off the table for November, but hopefully will take place next spring; and 3) Since the CFL is not running this season, there will be **no** Grey Cup Meeting, and most likely the chances or need of a November monthly meeting are very low — although we are now permitted to have limited gatherings in our parish hall if necessary.

The good news is that we have received a substantial pooling cheque this past September from Superior Shores Gaming Association, and in turn have written a cheque to the parish of \$2,700, SUPERIOR since the last transfer of funds took place more than six months ago. Remember: we are obliged to promote the facility as much as possible as failure to do so may result in the suspension of our lottery license which then will limit any further shares of bingo revenues into our account.
