Thursday, June 7 at 7 p.m.



LIBRARY SPEED-DATING Wednesday, June 20 at 6 p.m.






ABE LINCOLN AND HIS ARTIFACTS








HOW DO I GET A LIBRARY CARD?

Residents of incorporated Palos Park that are 6 and over are eligible for a free library card that is good for three years. Applying is easy! Bring in a photo ID and current proof of address (driver's license, state ID or utility bill). To renew your library card, bring in a valid ID with your current Palos Park address.

Do you live in an unincorporated part of Palos Park? If we are the closest public library to your home, you can purchase a non-resident Palos Park Public Library card for your household that is good for one year. Please contact the library at 708-448-1530 for the most current non-resident card fee.

Your library card can be used at over 75 libraries in the Chicago area. You can also use your card to access free ebooks, audiobooks, music, magazines and more at www.palosparklibrary.org!
