



**Diego Lerendegui (violinist/ composer/ arranger & musical director)**

Nowadays he is current member and musical director of Avellaneda Tango Orchestra

As classical performer was member of “Orquesta Estable del Teatro Colón”, “Orquesta Sinfónica de Radio Nacional”, chamber group of “Centro de Divulgación Musical” and “Orquesta Sinfónica de Avellaneda”.

As tango performer was stable member of many important orchestras including “Orquesta Osvaldo Pugliese” from 1983 until the Maestro's death in 1995. He was also arranger and leader violin since 1990. Then in 1995, he was stable member “Color Tango Orchestra” during 12 years.

Creator and conductor in 1988 of Female Tango Orchestra “Las Papiusas”, integrated by nine women.

As composer he made the music of the film “Dónde cae el sol” (2002) featured by Alfonso de Grazia and directed by Gustavo Fontán and “Edipo Rey”, directed by Javier Mollo. He has also composed and recorded many tangos.

He has published the book “Tango for Dummies” as author of this important international collection

As producer, he was the owner and artistic director of “Café de los Músicos” (1994/1997). There Adrián Iaies played for the first time parts his album “Las Tardecitas de Mintons” and Luís Salinas his album “Improvisaciones sobre Música Argentina”.

He was also manager of the “Color Tango Orchestra” (from 2001 to 2006)
