

Some key messages about bullying that we are sharing with the children this week are:

***Bullying is when someone*** - keeps picking on you **again** and **again**, makes fun of you a lot, tells other kids not to be your friend, tried to make you feel bad about who you are, tells nasty stories about you, keeps hitting or pushing you around.

***Bullying can happen*** - to anybody, anytime, anywhere, any way

***Being bullied can make children feel*** - sad, lonely, scared sick, hurt, angry, embarrassed and not want to go to school.

***If you see bullying at school-*** don't stand by and let it happen, walk away, don't laugh and join in, be kind to the student being bullied, show you care, take them away from the bullying, tell them no one deserves to be bullied, ask the student being bullied to join in with you and your friends.

## ENVIROSCHOOLS STUDENT HUI

"The World of Waste" was the theme for the Enviroschools Student Hui attended on Wednesday 16th May in Frankton along with other enviro-students from many other schools in the region. Students made connections with one another, shared ideas, sorted waste and studied the processes that give us plastics, aluminium and steel. The highlight of the field-trip was a tour of the Victoria Flats Landfill Facility in Gibbston. Students were astounded, shocked and disappointed by the reality of the waste people produce - 58 waste trucks - that is, 200-300 tonnes of waste ...each day, 30% of which is organic material that should go on the compost heap! Unbelievably this amount is increasing at 6% per month with current population growth in this area.

Fortunately there are great people working towards solutions like the company "MyNoke" that is trialling large scale worm farming at the Landfill site to help deal with greenwaste, sewerage and organic/food waste. Students ended the day by reflecting on the new things they had learnt and actions they could take back at school and home. The overall message of the day was clear - it is *everyone's* responsibility to Reduce the amount of waste going into landfills. Do you really need to buy all that plastic packaging? Can it be recycled?



## Health & Safety News: Winter Weather Reminders

We remind families of the following procedures if the winter weather is of concern:

- School closure decisions are made in conjunction with Cromwell College and Goldfields School. Norm Wing (Cromwell Bus Controller) makes the decision for early or late departures of buses and he contacts the radio station.
- Details of school late starts or closures will be broadcast on More FM 94.3fm or 531am, as early as possible.
- Details will also be available on our school facebook page, school web site ([www.cromprimary.school.nz](http://www.cromprimary.school.nz)) and on our school answer phone (445 0264).
- The school blackboard will provide up to date information about any closures or late starts.
- Bus families have already received a newsletter outlining all relevant details and also our school bus tree which we will put into operation if we have to organise for buses to leave school earlier than usual due to weather. If you have any concerns about road or weather conditions, or encounter a problem with the school bus in the morning please call Wendy (CPS School Bus Controller) directly on 0273931032 or 445 1146.
- Don't panic! If school is closed during the school day, children who are waiting to be collected will be kept safe and warm.
- It is important that school has up to date and accurate information regarding your contact details, including address, telephone and mobile.

### **Moving to, from and about the school safely**

- To avoid injuries on our grounds, please use steps and safety rails provided.
- Please remind your child that if they bike or scooter to school, once they are on school grounds they are expected to park up their bikes/scooters to avoid running into people on foot and causing injuries.
- Bikes and scooters must be parked in the stands provided. They must NOT be dumped on the grounds, paths or outside doorways as they are trip hazards.
- If your child is riding to school we recommend the wearing of high-visibility vests to ensure they are visible to other road and footpath users.
- We recommend that children riding scooters to school wear safety helmets.
- Take care over the winter and watch out for icy areas. Signage will be used at school if the paths are slippery.

### **Head Lice**

There have been reported cases of head lice at Cromwell Primary. Getting on top of head lice requires all parents to be vigilant and check their child's hair regularly - at least weekly. Parents often say, 'I don't know what I'm looking for,' and perhaps expect the critters to be bigger than they are or easy to detect. They're not, and that's what makes them such a surviving nuisance! Photos below are provided to give you an idea of how small they are. They require careful checking to detect. The eggs are also recognisable as they do not rub off the hair shaft and are located usually a few centimeters from the scalp. Good luck with the detective work. They can be extremely frustrating to get on top of, so please all make the effort to support the cause.



## Facts About Head Lice

- Nits (*the eggs of the head louse*) are small yellowish-white, oval-shaped eggs that are "to the side of a hair shaft glued" at an angle
- Nits must be laid by live lice. You cannot "catch nits"
- A female louse lays 3-5 eggs a day. Once laid, it takes 7-10 days for a nit to hatch, and another 7-10 days for the female to mature and begin laying her own eggs
- Head lice are clear in color when hatched, then quickly develop a reddish-brown color after feeding
- Head lice are about the size of sesame seeds
- Head lice have six legs equipped with claws to grasp the hair
- Head lice are crawling insects. They can't hop, jump, or fly
- Head lice do not thrive on pets
- Head lice are small, wingless insects which feed on human blood. They need human blood in order to survive
- Head lice live for approximately 30 days on a host and a female louse may lay up to 100 nits (*eggs*)
- Head lice off of their human hosts will starve. The NPA suggests that, in most cases, a head louse will not survive for more than 24 hours off of its human host

- **We have limited cash, so please endeavour to pay the exact amount of cash.**
- **You can pay regular amounts to cover costs e.g \$5 per week if NE-Y2, \$10 per week if Y3&4, \$15 Y5&6.**

## STUDENTS REQUESTING TO TRAVEL ON THE SCHOOL BUSES

We are frequently asked for non-eligible students to travel on the School Buses before or after school.

I have discussed this type of use of school buses with the bus company and re-read the rules from the Ministry of Education and the following is the stance that schools must follow. The Ministry of Education is clear in its regulations regarding the use of school buses by ineligible students. They are **not** entitled to travel on a school bus and if there was to be any type of accident or incident the bus company would lose their contract and the manager his job. Therefore please do not request for your child to use a school bus for transport as we cannot allow this to happen and it will be met with a refusal.


